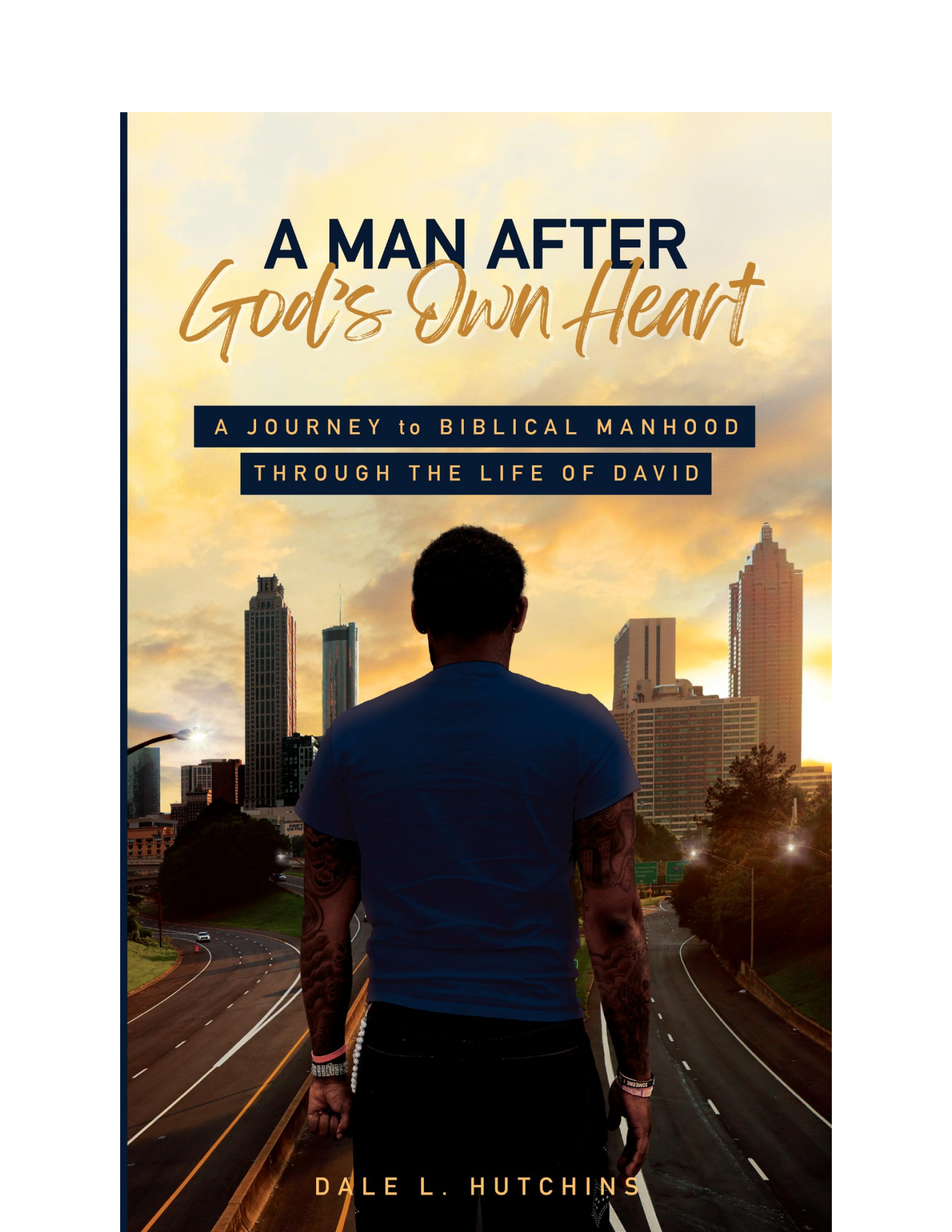

HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

Every week follows the same path.

READ

Read the chapter from the book and the Bible passage.

Don't rush.

God often speaks through His Word when we slow down enough to listen.

BIG IDEA

One simple truth.

If you remember nothing else...

Remember this.

FORGED

Steel becomes strong when it is placed in the fire and shaped by a skilled craftsman.

The same is true of a man.

God uses everyday experiences—victories, failures, challenges, waiting, and even difficult seasons—to shape us into the men He created us to be.

Each week you'll discover a **FORGED** statement.

It's one powerful truth to remember, write down, and live out.

Don't just read it.

Think about it.

Pray about it.

Live it.

Because God isn't just giving you information...

He's forging your character.

Key Question

Who am I becoming when I believe what God says about me instead of what everyone else says?



MISSION INTRO

Have you ever felt like you weren't enough?

Not smart enough.

Not athletic enough.

Not popular enough.

Not funny enough.

Not good-looking enough.

Not confident enough.

If we're honest...

almost every teenager has.

David knew what that felt like.

Before he ever faced Goliath...

he had to face something even harder.

His own brother told him to go home.

King Saul doubted him.

The soldiers laughed at him.

Everyone around David focused on what he lacked.

But David focused on what God had already done.

Here's the lesson:

You'll never defeat the giants around you until you know who you are in God.



READ

Book

Read **Chapter 2**

Bible

Read **1 Samuel 17:28–37**

As you read...

Notice every time someone tries to tell David who he is.

Then notice whose voice David believes.

BIG IDEA

Your identity isn't determined by your popularity...

your grades...

your athletic ability...

your family...

or your mistakes.

Your identity comes from God.

The world says...

"Prove yourself."

God says...

"You belong to Me."

When you know who you are in Christ...

you don't have to spend your life trying to impress everyone else.

FORGED

"Confidence isn't believing you're enough. Confidence is believing God is enough."

HEAD

What did I learn?

Why do you think David wasn't discouraged by his brother's criticism?

What had David already learned about God that gave him confidence?

Write one truth you discovered.

HEART

What is God changing in me?

Whose opinion affects you the most?

Friends?

Social media?

Teammates?

Teachers?

Parents?

Ask yourself:

"Am I allowing other people to decide my value?"

Write one lie you've believed about yourself.

Then write one truth from God's Word that replaces it.

MISSION INTRO

Everyone faces giants.

Some are easy to see.

Others aren't.

For some guys, the giant is fear.

For others, it's fitting in.

Maybe it's standing up for what's right when your friends make fun of you.

Maybe it's anxiety.

Maybe it's temptation.

Maybe it's believing you'll never be good enough.

David faced a giant named Goliath.

But the greatest battle wasn't against a nine-foot warrior.

It was deciding whether he would trust God or run away like everyone else.

The same decision faces us today.

READ

Book

Read **Chapter 3**

Bible

Read **1 Samuel 17:31–50**

As you read...

Pay attention to what David says about God before he ever picks up a stone.

BIG IDEA

Courage isn't pretending you're not afraid.

Courage is trusting God enough to obey Him even when you are afraid.

David didn't win because he was the strongest soldier.

He won because he believed God was bigger than the giant standing in front of him.

God never promised you would live without fear.

He promised you would never face your battles alone.

FORGED

"Faith doesn't make your giant smaller—it reminds you your God is greater."

HEAD

What did I learn?

Why do you think David saw the battle differently than everyone else?

What does this story teach you about trusting God?

Write one truth you learned.

HEART

What is God changing in me?

Think honestly.

What "giant" are you facing right now?

Fear?

Peer pressure?

Temptation?

Loneliness?

Now ask yourself:

Key Question

Who am I becoming when no one is watching?



MISSION INTRO

Have you ever been tempted to take the easy way out?

Maybe it was...

Cheating on homework.

Lying to avoid getting into trouble.

Sending a message you knew wasn't right.

Looking at something online you shouldn't.

Joining in when others made fun of someone.

Most people think integrity is tested when everyone is watching.

Actually...

Integrity is usually tested when no one is.

David had the perfect opportunity to solve all of his problems.

King Saul—the man trying to kill him—was alone and completely defenseless.

No one would have blamed David for striking back.

Even David's own men told him to do it.

But David knew something they didn't.

Doing what is easy isn't always doing what is right.



READ

Book

Read **Chapter 4**

Bible

Read **1 Samuel 24:1–22**

As you read...

Notice the difference between what David's friends wanted him to do and what David knew God wanted him to do.



BIG IDEA

Integrity means doing the right thing because it honors God—not because someone is watching.

David had every opportunity to take revenge.

Instead, he chose obedience.

Real integrity isn't built in big moments.

It's built through hundreds of small decisions that no one else ever sees.

The choices you make today are shaping the man you'll become tomorrow.



FORGED

"Your character is revealed by the choices you make when no one else knows."



HEAD

What did I learn?

Why do you think David refused to kill Saul even though everyone around him thought he should?

What does that teach you about honoring God?

Write one thing you learned.

HEART

What is God changing in me?

Think honestly.

Where are you most tempted to compromise your integrity?

At school?

Online?

With your friends?

At home?

When you're alone?

Circle one area and ask God to help you honor Him there this week.

Write your answer.

HANDS

What will I do this week?

Choose one way you'll practice integrity.

Examples:

- Tell the truth even if it's hard.
- Refuse to cheat.
- Walk away from gossip.
- Put your phone down when temptation comes.

- Keep a promise you've made.

Write your commitment.

Do the right thing when nobody else will ever know.

Don't tell anyone.

Don't post about it.

Don't look for recognition.

Let it be something only you and God know.

"Whoever walks in integrity walks securely..."

Challenge yourself to memorize the entire verse.

Shape my character so my life honors You in public and in private.

MISSION INTRO

Nobody likes to wait.

You wait for summer.

You wait to get your driver's license.

You wait to make the team.

You wait for college.

You wait for prayers to be answered.

Waiting can be frustrating.

Sometimes it even makes you wonder if God has forgotten about you.

David probably wondered the same thing.

God had already chosen him to be king.

But instead of living in a palace...

David was hiding in a cave.

Instead of wearing a crown...

He was running for his life.

The cave wasn't where David wanted to be.

But it was exactly where God needed him to be.

Sometimes God prepares us in places we would never choose for ourselves.

Notice how David encourages Solomon to seek God with his whole heart.
