Encountering the Risen Christ: When Believing Is Seeing

This year during the season of Easter, our assigned readings for worship give us a series of stories about people who encounter the risen Jesus - often in ways they did not expect. These gospel readings remind us that faith is rarely about having everything figured out. Instead, faith is a way of seeing: a way of recognizing Christ's presence in the ordinary rhythms of our lives, especially within His gathered community.

On the Second Sunday of Easter, we hear the well-known account of Thomas (*John 20:19-31*). Too often we call him "Doubting Thomas," but his desire is deeply relatable. He wants to *see* the risen Christ, to touch the wounds, to know that the crucified Jesus is truly alive. But the remarkable thing in this story isn't Thomas's doubt - it's Jesus' willingness to step into it rather than be offended by it or withdraw from it. Jesus meets Thomas right where he is and invites him into faith. And Thomas, in response, offers one of the most beautiful confessions in Scripture: "*My Lord and my God!*" Jesus' gentle message to Thomas becomes a message to us too: "*Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.*" Or, as we might put it today: Believing is its own kind of seeing!

The next Sunday, Luke tells us the story of two disciples on the road to Emmaus (*Luke 24:13-35*). They walk with Jesus for miles without recognizing Him. Only when He breaks bread at their table do their eyes open and their hearts catch fire with joy. This is one of the most powerful images in all of Scripture: Jesus makes Himself known in the breaking of the bread. It's a reminder that the risen Christ continues to come among us - not always through dramatic signs, but in the simple gifts of Word and Sacrament, in the fellowship of believers, and in the shared life of His Church.

Great modern athletes talk frequently about the importance of "visualizing." Wayne Gretzky famously said he learned to skate not where the puck *was*, but where it *was going*. Michael Jordan spoke about seeing the shot go in before it ever left his hands. Their message is simple: What you choose to look for shapes what you are able to see and do.

In a similar (*but far deeper*) way, the Scriptures invite us to "visualize" the presence of the risen Christ - to trust that He is with us, shaping our steps, guiding our lives, and meeting us in the places where grace is needed most. Faith doesn't require us to deny reality; it invites us to see a fuller reality - one where Christ is truly alive and at work.

Every time we gather at the Lord's Table, Christ meets us in the breaking of the bread. Every time we speak forgiveness, pray together, or bear one another's burdens, we are living testimonies that the risen Christ is still at work in His body, the Church. That is why I'm so excited for our congregation to welcome 11 new Stephen Ministers this month. Members willing to be "Christ with skin" walking alongside others in need. That is why I'm excited to be part of our Sunday school that continues to grow because we're "sharing Jesus." That is why I'm excited to see our Happy Stitchers and men's Kaffeeklatsch continue to have to pull another chair up to the table as they "share Jesus" through stitches, stories, service, and laughter.

Being part of FELC gives us so many chances to encounter Christ: in worship, in the shared meal of grace, in moments of forgiveness and acts of compassion, in the everyday presence of God's people. When we experience these moments it gives us an opportunity to be like Thomas and the disciples at Emmaus, our eyes are opened, our hearts are warmed and our faith is deepened.

This Easter Season May we learn to "visualize" the presence of Christ with renewed faith. May we look for Him in the ordinary. May we trust that He draws near whenever we gather, whenever we break bread, wherever we serve or extend grace. And in all these moments, may we discover again that the risen Jesus is still here - alive, present, and making Himself known.

Holy Week



Maundy Thursday marks the night of Jesus' last supper where He instituted the Lord's Supper and when He was betrayed. The word Maundy" comes from the Latin mandamus which means "commandment," because on this night Christ instituted the final commandment to love one another as He has loved us. The 7:15pm worship service will include communion in keeping with Christ's command to "Do This in Remembrance of Me." This part of the service focuses on Jesus reinterpreting the Passover meal into a "new covenant." We remember and celebrate his new covenant supper in remembrance of him for the forgiveness of sins.

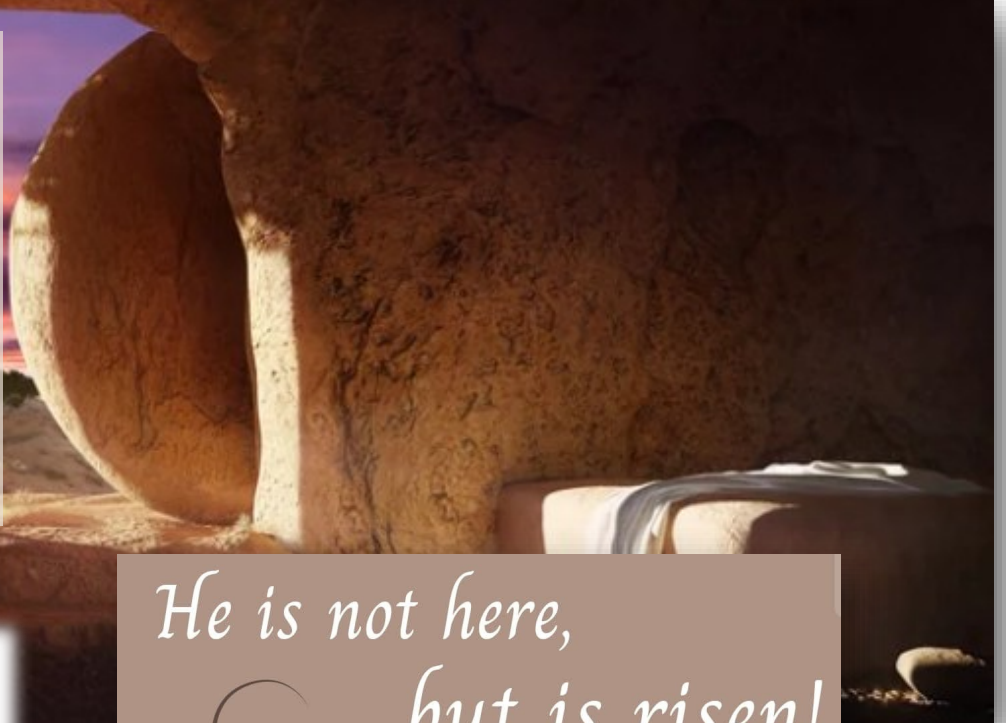
GOOD FRIDAY

Easter Sunday

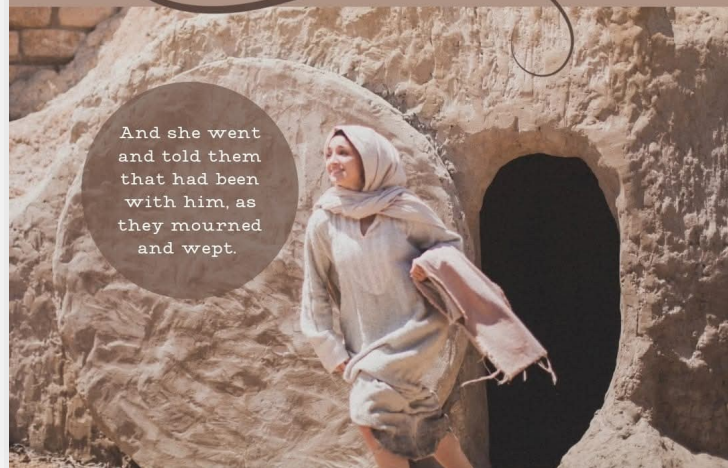

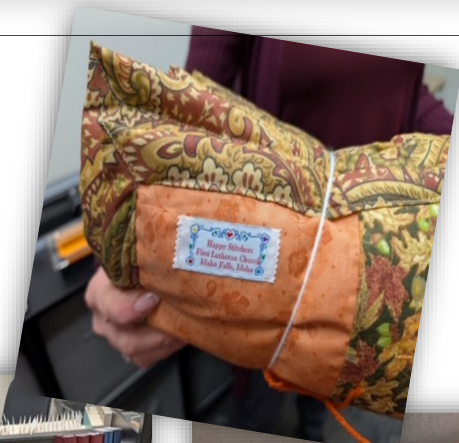

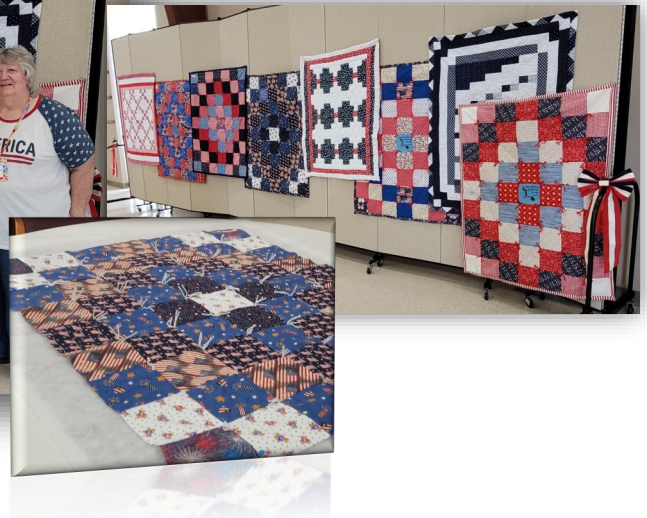
Happy Stitchers

Since January 1st, the Happy Stitchers have sent 130 lap quilts to Eastern Idaho Regional Medical Center for patients needing comfort. Recently, one Happy Stitcher got a tour of where the quilts are stored at EIRMC and how they are distributed. EIRMC volunteers roll each quilt, tie it with a bow, and ensure that the Happy Stitchers label is visible to the recipient. They put them on a cart that volunteers roll room to room and can deliver them to anyone needing some comfort.

We are also working on quilts for The Village for children in foster care and quilts for veteran's tiny homes near Boise through Christa Trinchera and the chaplains. We are wrapping the world in God's love, one quilt at a time!



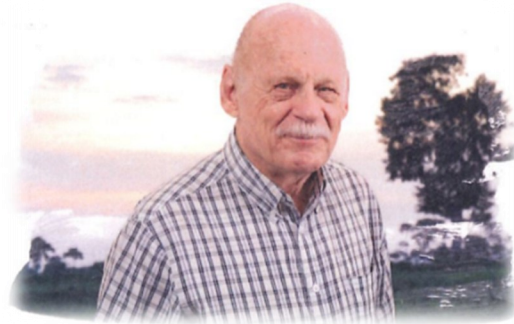
We met on March 31st to make patriotic quilts for Building Stronger Veterans. Their mission is to empower homeless veterans through housing, employment, and comprehensive support services.

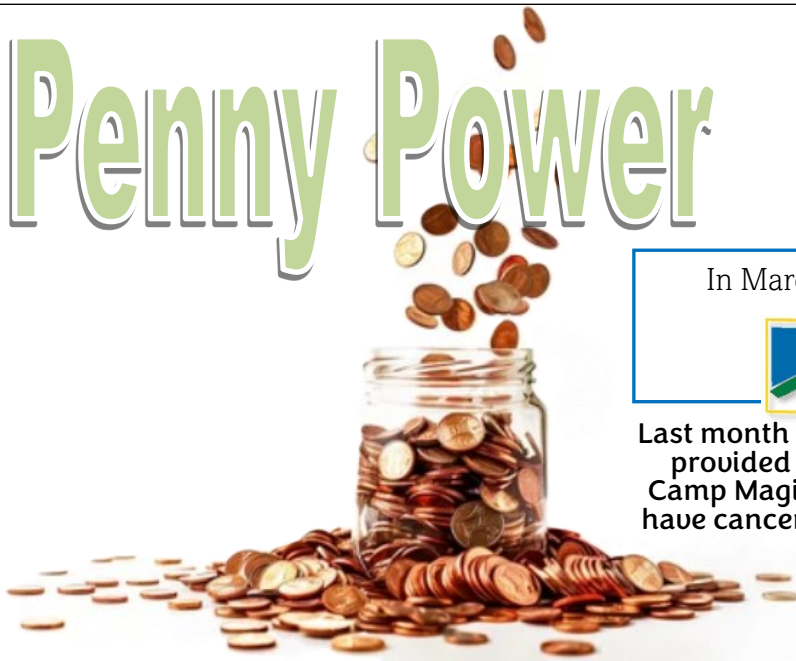

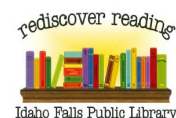
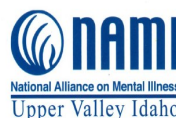

Thus, it is the opinion of this court, that if your client says there is no God, then he is a fool. Therefore, April 1st is his day.

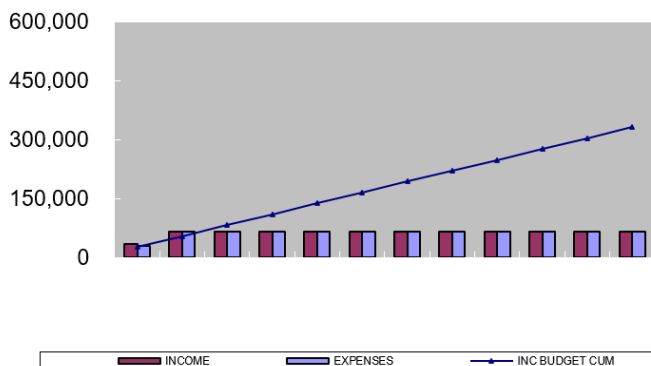

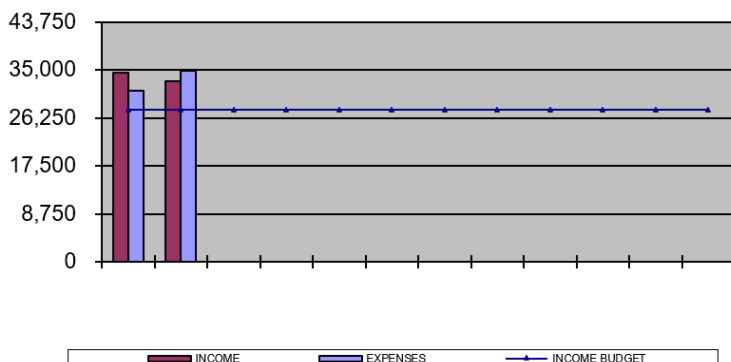
