I remember a cute devotion I heard over Christian radio about a lighthouse. During a naval training exercise riddled with poor weather conditions and heavy fog, a battleship's lookout reported to the captain: "Steady light, bearing on the port bow, Sir." The admiral called out, "Signal that ship! "We are on a collision course! Advise you to change course 20 degrees."" A return signal was quickly received, "Advisable for you to change your course 20 degrees." The assertive admiral, growing impatient, called out to the signalman, "Signal: I am a Navy admiral! Change your course 20 degrees now." Seconds later the signal was returned, "I'm a seaman second class. You had better change your course 20 degrees." The admiral, now furious, shouted out, "Send: I am a battleship. Change course 20 degrees immediately." A final signal was returned, "I am a lighthouse." ...The admiral changed his course.

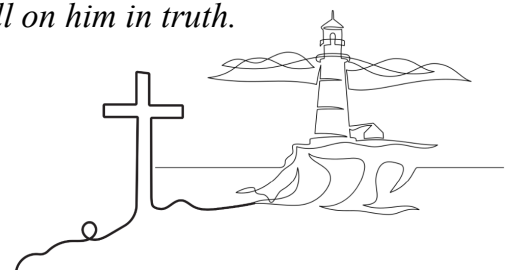
The speaker went on to say how important it is on our life's journey amidst storm-tossed seas to take life direction from something "rock solid" that doesn't get tossed to and fro. That is why we need to regularly reach out to God, our rock and redeemer and... lighthouse. God grants us ample opportunities to orient ourselves as we sail through life by communicating with him. God communicates to us through his Word, prayerful conversations, and meaningful worship.

I like to think that churches that encourage this strong communication between believers and God through Bible study, prayer, and worship are like little lighthouses. There are ways to avoid becoming a prideful yet disoriented admiral in life's journey; one of those is to know where the lighthouses are. FELC's fall schedule is starting up, and with that is a wealth of opportunities to appropriately affirm or change your life's course. There will be many opportunities to help you on the right course in life by checking in with God through worship, Bible study, and prayer. I encourage you to take advantage of the faith-light FELC readily shares each week. 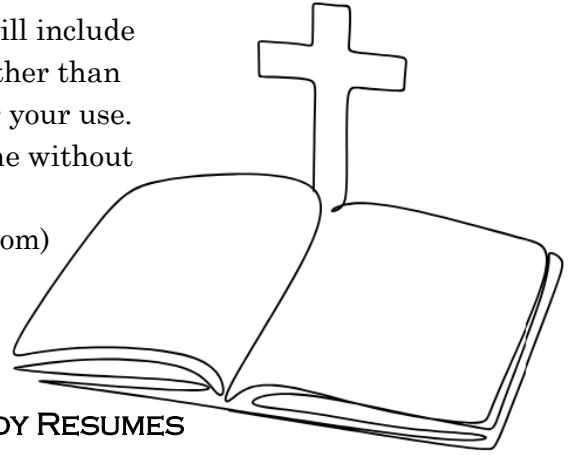

2026 SUMMER FELC DREAM TEAM DELI SUMMARY

Over four “Dream Team Deli” sessions in July 2026, congregation members gathered to reflect on our church's strengths, opportunities, and future. Through discussion, surveys, and prayerful conversation, a remarkably consistent picture emerged. The following is what we heard...

FELC'S GREATEST STRENGTHS

Biblical, Christ-Centered Worship

Strong preaching and teaching, Weekly communion, Excellent music ministry, Meaningful Lutheran participatory worship

Strong Relationships and Caring Community

After church fellowship coffee hour, Stephen Ministry, Happy Stitchers, Bible studies (Tues. or Wed. Women's, Men's Kaffeeklatsch), Gifted/Caring Staff, New member connections

A Heart for Service

Penny Power, Missions and Outreach, Community partnerships/Volunteer service ministries (Champ's Heart, FISH, Community Food Basket), Fiscally responsible, Preschool Ministry.

A Welcoming and Generous Congregation

Friendly atmosphere, Caring members (Stephen Ministry, Prayer chain, Transportation, Caring staff), Strong volunteer culture, Genuine concern for others, Fiscally responsible.

EVIDENCE OF GOD'S BLESSING: Participants consistently expressed gratitude for the growth and vitality God has provided in the past four years. Between 2021 and 2025, God blessed FELC with remarkable growth. Average in-person worship attendance increased **97%** (*from 71 to 140*). Online worship attendance increased **111%** (*from 45 to 95*). Total congregational income grew **55%** (*\$304,800 to \$472,500*). Operating reserves increased **78%** (*\$178,400 to \$316,700*). All while remaining debt free.

OPPORTUNITIES IDENTIFIED: The same themes surfaced repeatedly throughout all four sessions:

- 1. Reaching the “Middle Generation”:** Members expressed a strong desire to continue reaching and connecting to adults in the 20-50 age range. This focus includes single adults, couples without children, and especially young families.
- 2. Evangelism and Community Visibility:** The congregation believes more people in Idaho Falls should know who FELC is and what God is doing here.
- 3. Discipleship and Connection:** Participants suggested Bible studies & fellowship opportunities aimed at the “Middle Generation,” a centrally-organized women's ministry, mission experiences, and pathways for deeper spiritual growth.
- 4. Communication and Digital Ministry:** Improving our ability to communicate to a “digital generation” (website, social media presence, livestream experience) was a recurring theme.
- 5. Preparing for Growth:** Participants recognized that continued growth will require intentionality in specific areas: leadership development, volunteer engagement, communication systems, and ministry organization.

KEY CONCLUSION: When participants were asked what they hope people will say about FELC in five years, responses consistently reflected this vision: **“A Bible-based, growing, loving church that serves its community well and reflects the hands, feet, and heart of Jesus Christ.”** The Dream Team process revealed that FELC is not searching for its identity. We know who we are and what God wants us to be (see the **bold vision** above). It also revealed a congregation that is not merely surviving but thriving. God has blessed FELC with growth, new opportunities, strong leadership, and a renewed sense of purpose. The work before us is not to preserve what has been, but to faithfully steward these current and new blessings so that even more people may experience the inspiring, freeing, saving, love of Christ through the ministry of this congregation.

Continuing Education Opportunity: Ministering to Those Experiencing Grief

Grief touches every life, yet many of us struggle to know how to help those who are hurting. Join us on **Thursday, September 17, from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.** for a Stephen Ministry Continuing Education event, **open to the entire congregation**, on "**Ministering to Those Experiencing Grief.**"

Drawing from Stephen Ministry training materials (T-12), this session will briefly explore the commonly known "stages of grief" while focusing primarily on practical, biblical ways to care for and support people who are grieving. Participants will

learn helpful approaches that communicate Christ's love and compassion, as well as common pitfalls that can unintentionally make a grieving person's journey more difficult.

The class will be led by **Pastor Mike Knauff**, who has served as an ordained Lutheran pastor since 1989 and has been involved in Stephen Ministry as both a Stephen Minister and Stephen Ministry Leader since 1998.

Whether you are currently walking alongside someone in grief, have experienced loss yourself, or simply want to be better equipped to care for others, this session will offer valuable insights grounded in Scripture and Christian compassion. In order to prepare enough materials a sign-up sheet is located at the Welcome Window. All are welcome - members, friends, family - anyone who is interested in learning how to be Christ's caring presence for those who are grieving.

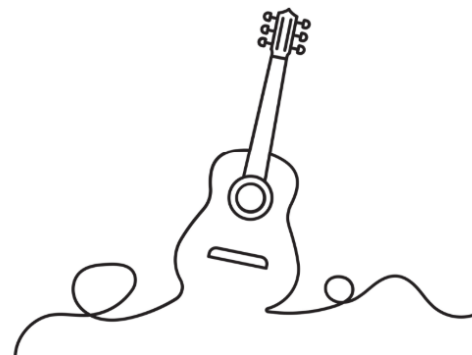
