In the 13th arrondissement, the Lord has opened doors to several new contacts. One of them, a young lady named Manuella, recently attended our Thursday Bible study. While we are still learning about her background, it is evident that she has a genuine desire to know God's Word. She asks many questions that reflect a sincere hunger to learn and grow in her understanding of Scripture. Please pray that the Lord continues to draw her to Himself.

On the family front, Trip and Theo finished school during the first week of July and are excited to enjoy two months of summer vacation. We would especially appreciate your prayers for Trip as he attends his first summer camp during the first two weeks of August. Please pray that the Lord would continue working in his heart, particularly in the areas of obedience and following Christ in baptism.

As mentioned earlier, France experienced its hottest and longest recorded heat wave during the last two weeks of June. In a country where air conditioning is uncommon, the extreme temperatures made daily life difficult, particularly in our attic apartment.
