Thank you to each of you who have committed to continue partnering with us as we transition into our new role as **Mission Director with the World Baptist Fellowship Mission Agency**. Your prayers, encouragement, and faithful financial support have made it possible for us to serve here for the past fourteen years, and we are excited to see how God will use this next chapter.

These last weeks have been a whirlwind! Between preparing for our move on **August 22**, packing our home, selling belongings, and completing ministry responsibilities, there has hardly been a slow moment. At the same time, we are trying to finish several projects at the school, church, and Visionland before we leave.

July also means **Summer Camp at Las Palmas Christian School**, and it has been a joy to watch the campus filled with laughter, learning, and opportunities to share Christ. One of the highlights for our family was having our son and granddaughter visit so she could attend camp. She quickly discovered that most of the workers spoke only Spanish, so she had no choice but to learn a few words herself! It never ceases to amaze us how naturally children embrace a new language and culture.

The Lord has also blessed us with several mission teams serving alongside the ministries over the past few weeks. One team from West Virginia led a three-day Vacation Bible School at our church in Ramón Santana. We began the week with just **17 children**, but by the final day **47 children** were attending! We are praying that the seeds planted through God's Word will continue to bear fruit in their lives.

Our teen camp was another tremendous blessing. Several young people made decisions to follow the Lord, and recently one young lady publicly testified of her faith through baptism. Today she faithfully serves each week on the church's Praise Team. Watching lives transformed by the Gospel never grows old, and these moments remind us why every prayer, every sacrifice, and every investment in missions is worthwhile.

On a personal note, we would appreciate your prayers for our daughter, **Katie**, who is currently serving in the United States Air Force in the Middle East. We ask that you pray for God's protection over her and all of our military personnel, and that they would soon be reunited safely with their families.

One burden for missions has grown heavier on our hearts over the past several years. Across many mission agencies, faithful missionaries are retiring, coming home due to health, or graduating to Heaven faster than new laborers are answering God's call. Jesus reminded His disciples,

"The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few." — Matthew 9:37
