If you are tuning in to Cherry Creek, welcome and thank you for worshipping with us on this Sunday morning.

Doxology with Alleluias is a departure from the normal setting of our doxology (whose tune is "Old Hundredth"). The departure is purposeful, however, and many churches do this. "Alleluia" is the Latin derivation of the Hebrew "Hallelujah," which means, "Praise the Lord." We sing the Doxology with Alleluias during the season of Easter (which includes Easter Sunday and the six weeks following) because the height of our joy and the culmination of Christ's work and our faith are found in His resurrection from the dead. The "alleluias" almost burst forth from our doxology in a "we can't help but shout out Your praises, Lord" sort of way, because Easter brings such exciting news!

Our Mission Spotlight today reminds us that mission isn't only about spreading the gospel abroad in places like Africa. We are called to be missionaries, right here! The time has come when the American church can no longer merely *send* missionaries. We must *be* missionaries.
