with us on this Sunday morning.

**What does "Consecration"
mean?** When we consecrate some-
thing, we set it apart for holy
use. We use this language in Com-
munion when we pray that God
would set aside the common, ordi-
nary elements of bread and wine for
the sacred use of mysteriously con-
necting us with Jesus Christ. But
we should also seek to consecrate
ourselves. We should seek to sub-
due our will and desires under-
neath God's authority, and we
should pray that God, in every
aspect of our life, would use us for
His glory and His ends. We
should be consecrated, set apart,
for God's holy use.
