If you are tuning in to Cherry Creek,
welcome and thank you for worship-
ing with us on this Sunday morning.

What is an Invocation? We “invoke”
God by calling upon Him or making
a plea to Him to make Himself pres-
ent to us. Of course, God is present
everywhere, but in our invocation
we acknowledge that God displays
His presence in a unique and spe-
cial way when His people gather
for worship.

Our invocation reminds us that
we do not worship by our own
power. We are in need of the call
of the Father, the blood of the
Son, and the quickening of the
Holy Spirit to come into God’s
presence for worship.

**Aren’t announcements a “pause”
from worship?** Colossians 3:16
says, “Let the word of Christ dwell
in you richly as you teach and
admonish one another with all
wisdom, and as you sing psalms,
hymns and spiritual songs.” These
passages help us realize that there
are vertical (us-and-God) dimen-
sions to worship, but there are also
horizontal (one another) dimen-
sions. When we greet one another
and share announcements, we are
attempting one practical outworking
of what it means to share in life to-
gether and to “teach and admonish”
one another in the context of worship.
