Note to Ministry Leader

Welcome! It's August—the start of a brand-new Scope & Cycle. You'll find monthly series as before, with a streamlined approach to direct all teaching straight to the Bottom Line each week. Look for a big focus on Faith Skills as we take four individual months during the year to unpack Hearing from God, Praying to God, Talking About God, and Living for God. Instead of headlining each month, virtues will show up in the application of the Bottom Line when and where they reflect the teaching. But before we get to Faith Skills or virtues, before kids DO a single thing, we want them to KNOW who they are. That's why we're taking August to dive in and explore the incredible truth that each one of us is a Masterpiece: Made by God—in God's very own image! Throughout the month, kids will discover that they are created for a purpose, that God can use everything in our lives, that every single person is of value because they are made in God's image, and that God has gifted us to work together to grow His kingdom.

Heads Up

For younger kids, the idea of being “made in God’s image” is quite abstract. Make sure to focus on how we do not look like God on the outside, but on the inside. Our hearts can reflect God’s heart. And we know what God’s heart looks like by studying the things that Jesus said and did, since Jesus is a perfect picture of God.

In Week 3, we talk about how God can use everything in our lives for His good purposes. There are likely kids in your ministry who have experienced very difficult, traumatic things. Make sure to explain how God never causes hard things to happen, but is with us in the hard things that do happen. God is so good and so powerful that He can take even the most terrible things and bring good out of them—even if we don’t get to see it right away.

Week	Bible Story	Summary
1	Image of God	This week, kids will discover that they are created in the image of God. And because Jesus is a perfect picture of God, they can reflect the image of God more and more clearly as they become more and more like Jesus. [BOTTOM LINE] <u>I am made in the image of God.</u>
2	Created for a Purpose	Through these Scriptures, kids will learn that God made each one of us for the same purpose—to love Him and love others. But God created each of us to do that in a different way! And kids don't have to wait until they are older to shine God's light and live into their calling. [BOTTOM LINE] <u>God made me for a purpose.</u>
3	In All Things God Works for Good	Through this passage from Romans, kids will explore how God can work for good in every single circumstance. 5	Gifted Together (Building the Tabernacle)	Through this story, we unpack how God gave specific gifts—from artistic talents to teaching skills and possessions—so that all the people could work together to construct God's Tabernacle. [BOTTOM LINE] <u>God grows his gifts in me to build His kingdom.</u>

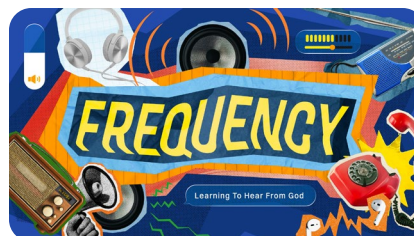

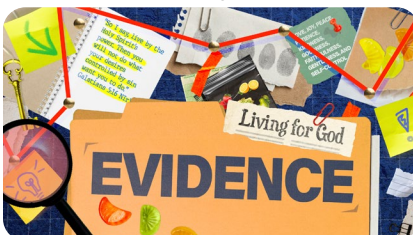

Social 15 minutes Providing time for fun interaction	Includes an opening activity as kids arrive. This time encourages kids to enter the classroom and engage with peers and Small Group Leaders by providing fun, age-appropriate, hands-on activities that introduce new concepts they will hear in the Bible Story.	→ Plan for one or more of the activities. → Review the Small Group document for props and supplies needed. → Lead activities in different areas of the room while a designated leader greets parents and children at the door.
Worship 10 minutes Inviting kids to respond to God	We recommend worship songs that amplify teaching content for the month. We've created these songs to be developmentally appropriate, incorporating simple, direct language, fun dance movements, and upbeat, current arrangements. Songs are preloaded into APlay .	→ Recommendation: Have a Worship Leader and live instruments to sing along with the music tracks. → Encourage small group leaders to model what it means to worship by participating in worship using words and motions and encourage children to follow along. → Share music links with parents so they can stream them at home or in the car.
Story 25 minutes Communicating God's truth in engaging ways	Includes various methods of storytelling to engage every kid as they learn about the Bible. This time encourages kids to be active participants in their faith and not just bystanders.	→ Teaching resources have been curated to your environment—whether using media, live, or a hybrid of both. Live scripts are written to be "told" and not "read." Advance preparation is necessary.
Groups 25 minutes Creating a safe place to connect	Includes activities written to reach every learning style. These activities will reinforce the Bottom Line introduced during the Bible Story and help kids apply it to real-life experiences.	→ Plan for as many of the activities as possible. → Review the Small Group document for props and supplies needed. → You may want to lead one activity at a time. Or offer two activities at once and allow half the children to participate in each. Then switch groups and repeat the activities.

How to Use

So as you plan, try mixing it up! You'll see an assigned Activity listed with each activity to show you how it's designed to engage kids best.

One week you might do a "Made to Move" activity, and the next week might be "Made to Create." Both help kids connect with God in meaningful ways.

Using a variety of activities throughout your time helps every kid feel seen and gives them a chance to connect with God's Word in a way that makes sense to them.

General Tips

Declutter your environment. While relationships matter most, a cluttered space is less inviting.

Create great signage that is easy for kids to read. If multiple small groups are meeting in one large room, consider using chalkboard easels or A-frame signs so parents and children can instantly see where to go.

Display the Theme Art, Bottom Line, or Memory Verse in photo frames at check-in so parents know what their child is learning.

You don't have to go all out, but even little touches go a long way! Think about the theme art colors, and utilize your screens if you have them.

Tips for This Month

Use these ideas as starting point to bring the theme to life in your space.

August → Made by God—God made me wonderful.

Time to get creative! Kids create something almost every day. So, let's use that creative impulse to help kids understand that God created them in His image and for His purpose. Think about decorating with gigantic art supplies: paintbrushes made from brooms, crayons made from pool noodles, or five-gallon buckets with colorful plastic tablecloths "pouring" out as paint. But don't forget the other ways kids are creative! Decorate with musical instruments and notes, or build with cardboard boxes or plastic cups. Create an interactive mural that reminds everyone they are God's masterpiece by covering a wall with thick butcher paper. Then invite children, volunteers, and even parents to stamp their hands on the paper using washable ink.

Create the Environment

September → Frequency—Learning to hear from God

Kids (and adults) are inundated with information from multiple sources. So, let's create a visual representation of the messages that compete for our time and focus as we engage kids in a conversation about hearing from God. Go retro by creating a 1980s boombox with large cardboard boxes, using mesh screen from the hardware store to add fun texture to the speakers. Old-school radios, phones, walkie-talkies, megaphones, and headphones are all ways we receive messages, so find fun ways to decorate with old and current tech. Use colorful tape or strips of paper to fill your walls with soundwave patterns with curvy lines or vertical bars.

October → The Safe Place—God is my strength

To help kids see God as our safe place, let's create some stormy seas. Create construction paper chain garlands using several shades of blue, and then shape them into big waves around an inflatable raft. Spell out "Safe Place" with white balloon letters, and tape against a blue-sky background. Cover hat boxes with white, black, or red butcher paper, and stack them to create a lighthouse. Add a battery-operated lantern on top to complete the look. Crumple grey butcher paper into rocks, and place them around the base of the lighthouse along with more construction paper chain garland. Continue the nautical theme on your walls with life preserver rings that have the memory verse written on them.

November → The Greater Gratitude Challenge—Thanking God for every good thing

Kids know the ups and downs of playing games, so let's use that to help kids embrace the challenge of showing gratitude to God, no matter what. Create large, colorful game boards and poster-size playing cards. Wrap large square cardboard boxes in brightly colored butcher paper,

and add large black dots to make gigantic dice. Lay a gameboard pathway on the floor using gaffer's tape, which won't leave residue behind when the month is over. Display this month's Bottom Lines and Memory Verse on game cards like Community Chest cards from Monopoly®. If you have a jumbo Connect Four®-style lawn game, pull it out to create an opportunity for kids to play after church.

December → THE PROMISE—Celebrating the gift of God's Son

Christmas is one of the busiest seasons in the life of a church, so let's create a warm and inviting environment. Bring out all the Christmas trees, hang all the lights, and wrap cardboard boxes in brightly colored wrapping paper. But let's also bring Advent and the nativity into focus. Create a series of Christmas "stamps" on posterboard, one for each Advent week: hope, peace, joy, and love. The symbols on the "stamps" can be generic Christmas symbols like trees, ornaments, gifts, etc., but adding the words is a simple touch that rises above the commercial side of the holiday. If you don't have a full nativity, put a doll wrapped in a blanket on top of some straw in a shallow cardboard box for a manger. Hang a star above the doll and twinkle lights behind the whole scene.

January → 24/7—You can pray to God anytime.

This month, let's help kids grasp the idea that they can pray to God anytime, even in the mundane, everyday kind of moments. Create night and day scenes such as a bed with a moon and stars hanging above, and a breakfast table with cereal and a bright sun. Decorate walls with clocks made from cardboard and butcher paper. Or make a series of giant smart watches, and on the watch faces, put the time and some corresponding symbols (7am with a sun, 12pm with an apple, 9pm with a bed). Consider creating giant

smartphones with different info on their lockscreens, such as time, weather, and a reminder to pray.

February → Side by Side—God made us to help each other. God is always there to help us and has empowered us to help others, so we are using teamwork in sports to engage kids on the topic. Decorate with beachball or mylar balloon versions of baseballs, basketballs, and soccer balls. Lay down some artificial grass, and add base markers to create a baseball diamond. Set up a soccer goal or one of the larger preschool basketball hoops. Decorate walls with a coach's diagrams of plays. (For example, start with a basic template of a basketball court. Add dots to represent the players and curved arrows showing where players should move during a play.) Cut out life-size kid shapes from colorful butcher paper, and tape them on the wall. To make it more personal, ask kids to decorate one of the shapes so it looks like them.

March → The Greatest Rescue—How Jesus came to save us.

As we walk through Holy Week this month, let's engage our kids with a travel theme. Jesus went to great lengths to rescue us, and everything that happened was definitely something to write home about. Decorate with posterboard-sized postcards and "stamps," decorating each one with a simple symbol from the Bible stories: temple or whip, perfume jar, palm branch, cross, and empty tomb. Display maps that point out the different locations: Bethany, Jerusalem, the temple, and the Garden of Gethsemane. Consider putting the names of volunteers and children on hearts or postcards as a reminder of who Jesus came to rescue.

April → The Greatest Story—Talk about God

After witnessing the greatest rescue, it is our turn to tell the greatest story as we embrace the Great Commission and talk about God with others. Think about telling a story around a campfire. Set up undecorated Christmas trees and an inflatable or cardboard campfire prop. Fill out the scene with a tent or sleeping bags. Or set up a shadow puppet scene with stick-figure puppets between a hanging sheet and a bright light. Puppets can be arranged to show one talking to several others.

May → The Evidence—Living for God

Let's help kids look for the fruit of the Spirit with an evidence board made with lots of Post-It Notes® and pieces of notebook paper. Notes and papers can have a fruit of the Spirit written on them or small sketches of fruit, hearts, a cross, or simple stick figures. Connect the notes with a red ribbon. Use pool noodles to create giant magnifying glasses on the walls, and write one fruit of the Spirit inside each magnifying glass. Tape solid color paper plates onto the walls in the shape of fruit. For example, create a watermelon slice using green paper plates for the rind, red or pink plates for the watermelon flesh, and black construction paper cutouts for seeds. Inflate fruit-shaped pool floats, and hang fruit-themed beachballs from the ceiling.

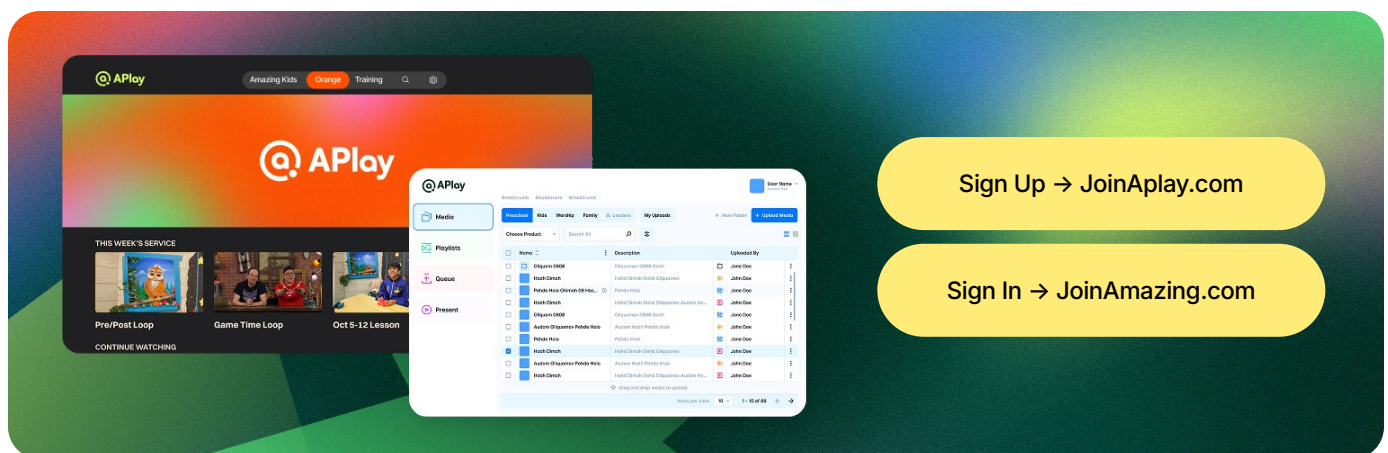

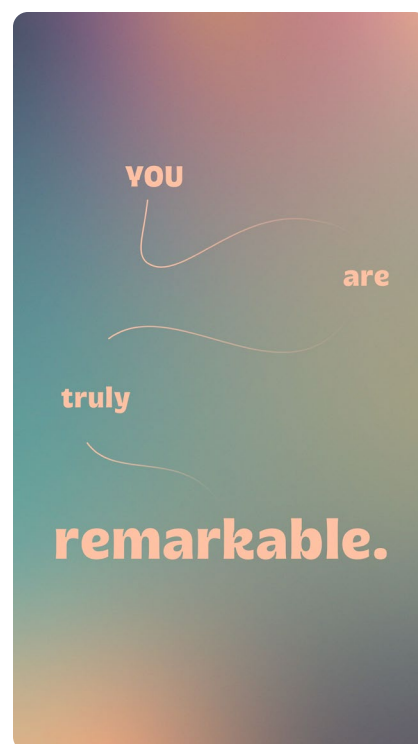

Statement of Faith

About God

There is one, and only one, living and true God, existing in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God is just, powerful, good, and holy. God is infinite in love. Through love, God creates, sustains, suffers, judges, rescues, liberates, redeems, reconciles, and reigns.

About Jesus

God became human in Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended to the dead, and on the third day He rose again. He ascended into heaven, and will come again to judge the living and the dead. The death and resurrection of Jesus offers redemption for humanity and the world.

About The Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity, the fully divine Spirit of God, whose present activity is to guide, to convict, to comfort, to transform, and to strengthen. The Spirit bestows gifts, and cultivates the character and mind of Christ in believers for use in and through the Church.

About The Bible

The Holy Scripture was written under the divine inspiration of the Holy Spirit. It is accurate, reliable, and authoritative. It is the primary authority for all Christian faith and practice. The Scripture reveals the character of God, the nature of humanity, and the primacy of Jesus.

About Salvation

Jesus, being fully God and fully human, was born, lived, died, and rose again. It is only through Christ Jesus that humanity can find complete forgiveness, reconciliation, and wholeness.
