Bottom Line: God made me wonderful.

Memory Verse: How You made me is amazing and wonderful. • Psalm 139:14 Nlrv

EveryChild tips

- If children don't like the feel of paint, offer them crayons or markers to draw hair instead.
- This activity is about fun and exploration, and that can sometimes get messy. Using smocks and having wipes ready makes cleanup easy and stress-free.

What You Do:

Before the Activity: Print "My Wonderful Hair" on cardstock in a variety of skin tone colors, one per child and leader. Write each child's name on their paper. Cover table with the tablecloth. Pour some paint on each plate, three sets of plates for each Small Group.

During the Activity: Give each child a "My Wonderful Hair" Activity Page and a fork. Demonstrate how to dip the back of your fork into the paint, then press and drag it on the paper. Encourage children to paint the hair on their paper in any of the colors they want. Clean hands as needed.

After the Activity: Connect the Bottom Line to the Bible Story.

What You Say:

Before the Activity: "Come on over to the table! Our Bible Story says something SO amazing! It says God knows every single hair on your head! Let's make a picture and give our friend some wonderful hair."

During the Activity: "Look at the face on your picture. (*Point to the paper.*) The face doesn't have hair. Let's help them out. We can use these special tools to give them hair. First, dip the back of your fork/comb into the paint. Just a little bit! (*Demonstrate.*) Now, press it on your paper and drag it down to make hair! (*Pause.*) Look! I made some hair! You try! (*Let children explore making paint marks on the paper.*) You can make long hair or short hair! Wiggly hair or straight hair! (*Pause.*) Great job! Let's clean our hands and let our pictures dry." (*Help children clean their hands.*)

After the Activity: "Look at all this beautiful hair you made! It is so amazing that God knows every hair on YOUR head. He knows your name, He sees you all the time, and He loves you so much! **Who made you wonderful? [Bottom Line] God made me wonderful!!**"

What You Need:

- "My Wonderful Hair" Activity Page, one per child and leader
- Cardstock in a variety of skin tone colors, one piece per child and leader
- Washable paint (brown, black, yellow), one per Small Group
- Paper plates, nine or more per Small Group
- Plastic forks, one per child
- Baby wipes, one package per Small Group
- Plastic tablecloth, one per Small Group
- Permanent marker, one per Small Group
- *Optional: Small, wide-toothed combs, one per child*

Optional EveryChild Supplies:

- *Crayons or markers, several per child*
- *Smocks, one per child*

What You Do:

- Print "My Wonderful Hair" on cardstock in a variety of skin tone colors, one per child and leader.
- Write each child's name on their paper.
- Cover table with the tablecloth.
- Pour some paint on each plate, three sets of plates for each Small Group.
