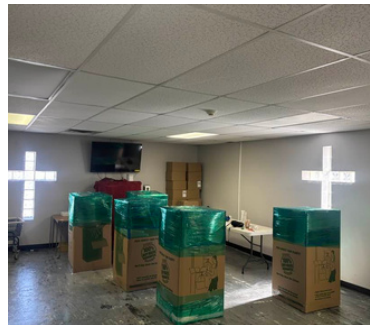
LATIN AMERICA MISSIONS

Worry & Fear

So many people including Christians are living in fear. Fear of wars, illness, financial difficulties, and life in general. What does the Bible have to say about fear. Joshua 1:9: "I hereby command you: Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you "...wherever you go." (NRVS throughout) God commands Joshua be not frightened or dismayed! God does not say I suggest you be not frightened or show fear. God commands Joshua to be strong and courageous. God does not change so what is commanded of Joshua is commanded of us!

Fear happens to us in an instant before we know it fear is upon us. Fear prowls around waiting to pounce, because it is from Satan. I Peter 5:8b: "Like a roaring lion your adversary the devil prowls around, looking for someone to devour." Fear is blinding and all consuming, it devours our faith. But how do we overcome fear? God tells how to overcome fear. Psalm 47:10-11: 10 "Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth. 11 The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge." God is showing us what do, how to overcome fear. Be still take a deep breath meditate on knowing God oversees the universe. The Great God Almighty sees our every need and takes care of us. He says not to worry! Worry and fear are compatriots and eat away our faith. Be still when a trial or tragedy happens and think back on every event in your life and how God took care of you. Know that God will take care of you this time and the next and the next. He will take care of you every time! God is our refuge. We go into our refuge by meditating on the ways he saves us, every day. God cares for the birds, flowers, and grass. We are His children, and He will care for us (Matthew 6:25-34). Worry leads to fear which is paralyzing. Fear not only eats away the faith we have but prevents faith from growing, because all we can see is the wall of which we are afraid. Fears is a curse, and it is unnecessary because God cares about everything in our lives, from the little mundane things to the giants we must slay. Why else would he know how many hairs our on our head? The wall of fear prevents us from entering the refuge Who is God.

Israel wandered in the wilderness 40 years because of fear. The fear led to rebellion and lack of faith, so they were confined to a desert in which they wandered. Fear confines us to a desert without the refuge of God. We wander afraid to trust God. We become afraid to step into the future He has prepared for us. Just as Israel was afraid to step into the promised land because of the fear of giants, we become afraid to step into the promise of refuge in God. We have no need to fear evil because God is with us. King David dedicated a whole chapter on trusting god. Psalm 23:1-6: (1 The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want.) We have no need to fear tomorrow our Good Shepherd provides for us. (2 He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters;) Green pastures and still waters are peaceful and calming. They are easy to sit and meditate nearby. God provides peace for us to become close to Him. He takes away our fear. (3 He restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake) Fear is damaging to our soul, because it eats away our faith. God restores our soul to take away fear and lead us into His refuge. (4 Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff— they comfort me.) We walk through the dark valley, wandering the desert of this world every day. Our Good Shepherd is with us every moment protecting and comforting us. The Holy Spirit is our Comforter and resides in every Christian giving us peace and comfort. Since our God is constantly with us, we have no reason to fear. (5 You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows). God provides our every need. While those around us are living in fear, we are continuously blessed. God cares for us constantly. The sheep did not know what was going on, but we're still taken care of. God takes care of us when we are aware and when we are not. (6 Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord my whole life long.) Follow God's command not to fear, for He promises goodness and mercy to us all the days of our lives, and life in His house.
