

Series: What Will I Do in Heaven?

Week of May 3, 2026

Theme: Heaven is not boring—it's a return to meaningful work and relationship with God

Texts: Genesis 1:26–28; Genesis 2:15; Genesis 3:17; Revelation 22:5; John 17:3; Ephesians 2:10

Leader Reminder

Goal of Group

1. Prayer (seek God together)
2. Connection (share life and listen well)
3. Questions (engage Scripture and sermon themes)

Reminder: Don't sacrifice prayer and connection just to get through all the questions.

Warm-Up

What's your idea of a "perfect vacation"? At what point do you think it might start to feel repetitive or boring?

Dig Deeper

1. When you think about heaven, have you ever pictured it as boring or repetitive? Why do you think that idea is so common? (Revelation 22:5)

Leader Note: Keep this light and honest. Help people admit misconceptions without shame.

2. Read Genesis 1:26–28 and Genesis 2:15. What do these verses show about why God created humans?

Leader Note: Emphasize identity as image-bearers who work and rule with God.

3. If work was part of God's good design, why does it often feel frustrating today? (Genesis 3:17)

Leader Note: Distinguish between work (good) and toil (curse).

4. Read Revelation 22:5 and 2 Timothy 2:12. What does it mean that we will reign with God?

Leader Note: Focus on purpose and relationship, not specifics.

5. Jesus said eternal life is knowing Him (John 17:3). How does that change your understanding of when eternal life begins?

Leader Note: Emphasize that eternal life begins now through Jesus.

Application

1. Where in your life does your work feel more like "toil" than purpose? How might your perspective change?
2. What is one specific way you can live out your assignment this week?

Prayer Focus

Thank God for purpose, ask for renewed perspective on work, and pray for opportunities to live out your calling this week.
