Missionaries Passage: Matthew 25:19-21

"Now after a long time the master of those servants came and settled accounts with them. And he who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five talents more, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me five talents; here, I have made five talents more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.'"

If you are a parent and must leave your children for a while, do you give them a list of tasks? What do you expect when you return? That they followed your instructions, right? When the master returned from his trip, he immediately settled his accounts with his servants. The man with five bags of gold was delighted to tell his master he had gained five additional bags of gold.

The master commended his faithful use of a

few things and entrusted him with more because the servant was trustworthy. His master's response contains the words all Christians long to one day hear, "Well done, good and faithful servant" (v.21). This parable demonstrates God's desire for you to faithfully use what He has entrusted you with, big or small.

Pray that missionaries would be trustworthy and faithful to use the resources God has given them to further the gospel.
