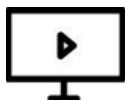

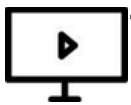

A Brief Statement of Faith - Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) (1983)

After the two largest streams of Presbyterianism in the United States reunited to form the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) in 1983, a committee was appointed to draft a confession that would briefly summarize our faith. Like the earliest creeds it is liturgical in style and suitable for use in worship. Banner: Cross: a rainbow of colors representing the celebration of unity with the diversity of cultures and races; Blue Background: The Universe as the light of the word of God bringing us together; Secure Hands of God: He who holds our world together will unite us in the grace of Jesus Christ; Symbol of the PC(USA).

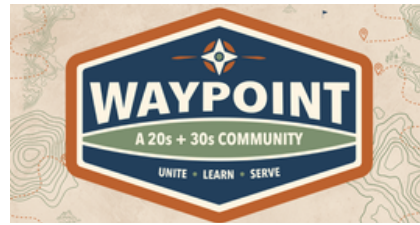

SUMMER SERIES

ALWAYS ALREADY LOVED: A BRIEF INTRODUCTION TO THE CHRISTIAN FAITH

This summer, Waypoint is spending three months with one big question: what does the Christian faith actually confess, and why does it matter?

We'll be reading and discussing Pastor Landon's new (short!) book, *Always Already Loved*, which walks through the Presbyterian Brief Statement of Faith line by line- exploring what it means to belong to God, who Jesus is and what he's still doing, and how the Holy Spirit is at work in and through the church right now.

Every participant will receive a copy of the (short!) book ahead of time. Come having read the assigned section. Come with questions. Come even if you're not sure you believe any of it yet.

WE TRUST IN GOD (CHAPTERS 5-7)

The confession turns to the God Jesus reveals- creator, covenant-maker, faithful parent. We'll explore what it means that God created the world good, that we rebel and hide, and that God's response to our failure is "yet."

THE SPIRIT AND THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH (CHAPTERS 8-12)

August 9 | 6:00pm | WPC

The confession gets practical. We'll talk about what the Holy Spirit is actually doing- in justification, in Scripture and sacraments, in giving the church courage to pray, witness, unmask idolatry, hear silenced voices, and work for justice. We'll end where the confession ends: "Nothing in life or in death can separate us from the love of God."

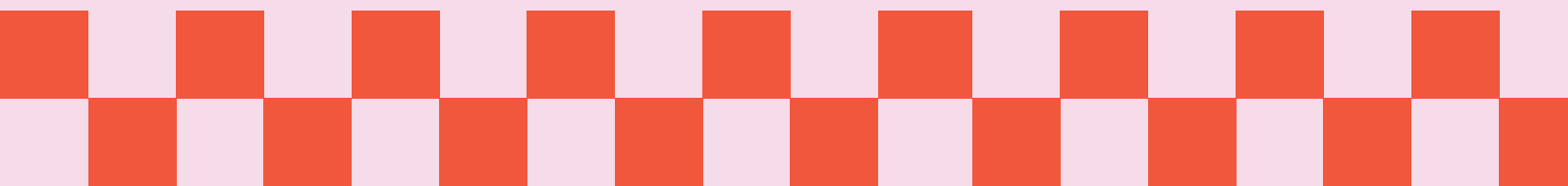
