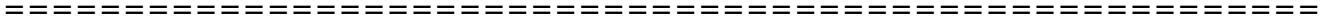

The CAROL and CHRISTOPHER KINGHAN GIVING HEARTS Memorial Scholarship Awarded to Logan Walsh

Christopher Kinghan was born on March 16, 1988. He was baptized and confirmed at Village Lutheran Church and also attended The Chapel School. Christopher died unexpectedly on January 5, 2013 surrounded by his loving family. Christopher's life was characterized by joy and love towards others. His mother, Carol, and the Kinghan family established the *Heart of Giving* Scholarship to remember Christopher's legacy and to encourage a deserving student entering The Chapel School 6th grade who exemplifies Christopher's love of giving and helping others.

On July 31, 2014, after a long battle with cancer, Carol too passed away. Her family grieved her loss but celebrated her awesome life and the eternal life that she now shares with her son, Chris, and all the faithful departed.
