



FOCUS ON WORSHIP Numbered Among the Saints By Deborah Reiss



It was now about the sixth hour, and darkness came over the whole land until the ninth hour, for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." When he had said this, he breathed his last. (Luke 23:44-46)

"The ninth hour" refers to the ancient Jewish way of reckoning time and is equivalent to our modern 3:00 p.m. It is a detail in the crucifixion story that is familiar but that we can easily overlook. In fact, I originally thought to myself "There is nothing significant about the number 9 in the Bible."

Christians do often keep the tradition of holding Good Friday services between 12:00 and 3:00 (the sixth to the ninth hour), to specially mark those hours that Jesus hung on the cross. However, there is an even deeper significance from a Jewish perspective. God commanded Moses that two lambs were to be sacrificed on the altar every day, one in the morning and one in the evening. This burnt offering was a sign that the tabernacle/temple was a place consecrated to the glory of God where He would meet with His people. According to scholars, the time for the "evening sacrifice" in the temple was the ninth hour of the day. This was a collective sacrifice on behalf of the people, and every Jew knew that the ninth hour was the appointed time.

It was the ninth hour when Jesus cried out "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" It was the ninth hour when the curtain of the temple was torn from the top. It was the ninth hour when Jesus "gave up his spirit." The Lamb of God had now been sacrificed and declared, "It is finished." No more sacrifices needed to be made. Jesus had been forsaken so that we would not be. The barrier between God and His people, symbolized by the curtain around the Holy of Holies, had been broken. The living God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, would come to dwell within us so that we might be consecrated to His glory.

So any given day, when the clock strikes 3:00, we have an opportunity to remember what wondrous love came out of the darkness and turned it into a new day. The Book of Common Prayer offers a beautiful way to focus our eyes on Jesus:

Blessed Savior, at this hour You hung upon the cross, stretching out Your loving arms. Grant that all the peoples of the earth may look to You and be saved; for Your tender mercies' sake. Amen.

Our theme this year is *Saved to Serve*. We will focus on how we can serve others and ourselves through the gifts that God has given us.


