- Week #1 – God’s Grace Provides All We need
 - Generosity is a choice
 - Adam and Eve – Genesis 2:4b-3:24 – chose scarcity
 - Jesus encourages generosity - Matthew 6:24-34
 - The Next Level Generosity Team
 - Helping Shiloh live into our Vision.
 - Choose to be generous and it will transform Shiloh and it will transform the world.
- Week #2 – Generosity is the Way We Impact the World
 - Christians love Matthew 25 – “The Sheep and the Goats.”
 - It presents two kingdoms – reward and punishment.
 - hungry and thirsty
 - a stranger and naked
 - sick and imprisoned
 - What if we looked at this story from the perspective of those being helped rather than those doing the helping?
 - What is the impact if I’m:
 - Hungry or thirsty
 - a stranger or naked
 - sick or imprisoned.
 - The impact is tremendous.

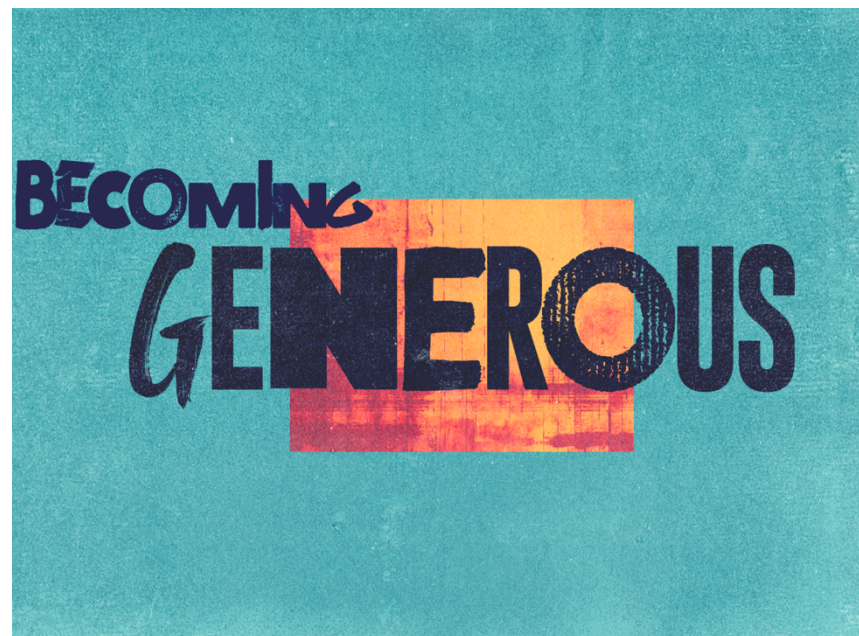
