On Sunday, May 31st, we celebrated "Community Sunday." During the combined worship service at 10:00 o'clock, our **graduating seniors and the recipients of the 2026 Saint Luke Foundation grants** were our honored guests. Grant recipients were recognized during the combined 10:00 am worship service, and were invited to be our guests at the church-wide covered dish luncheon following the service.

The Pastors' Page

“Now Dinah, the daughter Leah had borne to Jacob, went out to visit the women of the land. When Shechem son of Hamor the Hivite, the ruler of that area, saw her, he took her and raped her.” (Genesis 34:1-2) “Now Joseph was well-built and handsome, and after a while his master’s wife took notice of Joseph and said, “Come to bed with me!” But he refused...And though she spoke to Joseph day after day, he refused to go to bed with her or even be with her.”

(Genesis 39:6b-8a, 10)

Siblings do not have a good reputation in the book of Genesis. From the first sibling homicide to the silver cup debacle, the siblings of Genesis often end up fighting, tricking one another, sending each other off to violent ends, with seemingly little in common besides their parents. However, the half-siblings Dinah and Joseph, while never explicitly interacting one-on-one in the Bible, have very similar stories and experiences. Their births are back-to-back, and they are the only two children of Jacob to experience sexual violence, with Dinah being raped by Shechem and Joseph being sexually assaulted by his master’s wife. I grew up hearing the story of Joseph and Potiphar’s wife and being taught that it was a story of Joseph resisting temptation. However, given that Joseph was a slave and Potiphar’s wife had complete power and control over him, Joseph was risking his life to say “no,” and as we see later in the story, Potiphar’s wife tries to overpower him even after being refused. Yet, very few people have read their stories together. In fact, most scholars and readers of the Bible have silenced and denied Dinah’s and Joseph’s experiences of sexual violence. By denying their experiences, we have separated these siblings and have overlooked the connections between their lives and stories. In my thesis, which I spent my last semester in school writing, I argued that the stories of Dinah and Joseph should be read together to highlight the similarities between their stories: themes of trauma, sexual violence, and the metaphor of the body. Additionally, they should be read together to show the contrasts in their stories: themes of gender, silence and voice, future and end, and God’s absence and presence.

Most people have never read Dinah’s and Joseph’s stories together! But when we do, it allows us, as the reader, to bear witness to their trauma and experiences of sexual violence. From birth to burial, Dinah and Joseph were connected. Even as children of opposing wives, they were born close together in time. They both experienced trauma and sexual violence, and were a part of each other’s stories. And even in death, their places of burial marked where the other sibling experienced sexual violence, a permanent witness to each other’s suffering: Dinah was buried in Egypt, where Joseph was sexually assaulted, and Joseph was buried in Shechem, where Dinah was sexually assaulted. In a Biblical canon full of siblings who kill, trick, and steal from each other, these sexually assaulted siblings were the first pair who had the help of their sibling, a fellow witness, and a partner in suffering. In the same way, as readers of the Bible, we must continue to read their stories together and bear witness to their suffering. When we practice reading, believing, and witnessing the pain of Dinah and Joseph, we also prepare ourselves to listen, believe, and witness the pain of those around us, especially the pain of those who are survivors of sexual violence.

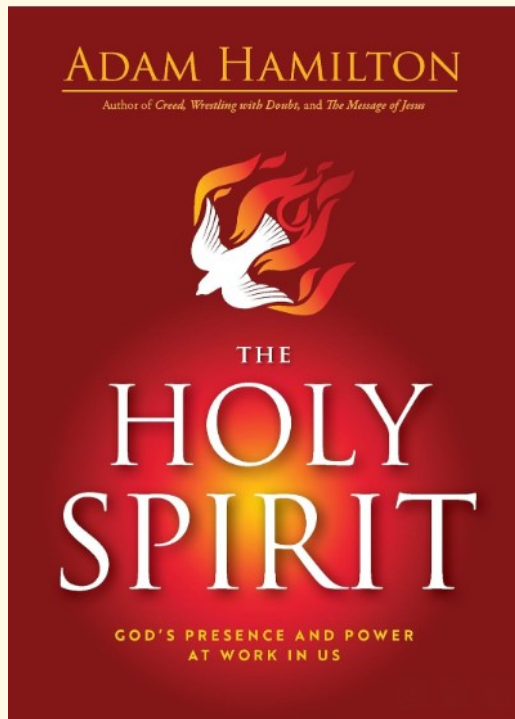

Summer Bible Study!

This year our Summer Bible study is a five-week study on the Holy Spirit, the often-overlooked person of the Trinity (Father, Son, Holy Spirit). This study will meet from 4:00-5:00 pm every Monday in August: August 3, 10, 17, 24, 31. We will meet in Room 227 (Asbury Room). All are welcome to participate. This study will be led by Rev. Charlotte Brendel.

For this Bible study, we will use Adam Hamilton's most recent book, *"The Holy Spirit: God's Presence and Power at Work in*

Us." We will explore together how the Holy Spirit is at work in the world. The Holy Spirit is God's active presence and power at work in the world and in our lives.
