5. Have you ever found yourself saying, "If I just had a little more money, then I would feel secure"? Why do you think that mindset is so common?
6. Read **Luke 16:10**. Why do you think God cares so much about faithfulness in small things?
7. What is the difference between seeing yourself as an owner versus seeing yourself as a steward?
8. Read **Exodus 16:19-20**. What fears make it difficult for people to trust God with their finances?
9. What are some promises money makes that only God can actually fulfill?
10. Read **Acts 17:24-25**. If God does not need anything from us, why do you think He still calls us to give, serve, and obey?
11. In what ways can generosity help strengthen your trust in God?

12. Read **1 Timothy 6:17-18**. According to these verses, where should our hope be placed, and why?
13. What are some practical ways people place their hope in money without even realizing it?
14. If someone examined your calendar, bank statement, and priorities, what would they conclude matters most to you?
15. Imagine standing before Christ one day. What do you hope mattered most about the way you used your time, talents, and resources?
16. What did you do last week to be a blessing to someone? Share with the group. And what are you planning for this week?
