Get To Know You Question:

What is something you used to love doing that you wish you still made time for today?

Let's Dig Deeper

Someone read **1 Peter 2:5**. Spend some time and share some key words that spoke out to you while reading. What is it about those words that spoke to you?

1. Peter describes believers as "living stones" being built into a spiritual house and a holy priesthood. What does it practically look like for Christians to become something together rather than simply attend something together?
2. Christianity was never meant to stop at information but produce transformation. What are some signs that a person is gaining biblical knowledge without actually becoming more like Christ?
3. Culture shapes people. Entertainment shapes people. Fear shapes people. Comfort shapes people. Looking honestly at life right now, what has been shaping you the most lately?
4. Someone read **Exodus 28:1**. God chose Aaron and his sons for priesthood. Why do people sometimes struggle to believe God can genuinely use them after failure, weakness, or seasons of spiritual drifting?
5. The tribe of Levi was not chosen because they were naturally impressive. How does God's pattern of using broken people challenge the way we often view ourselves or others?
6. Someone read **John 15:16**. Jesus says, "You did not choose me, but I chose you." How does understanding that God saves us into purpose, calling, and identity change the way we approach our daily lives?
7. Moses spent time in God's presence and it visibly changed him. What habits or priorities help keep someone genuinely close to God rather than merely religious?
8. What are some subtle ways Christians can settle for attendance instead of transformation?

9. Someone read **Titus 3:5**. Why do people often struggle to believe they are truly forgiven and cleansed by Christ rather than permanently defined by past failures?
10. When disappointment with people grows, bitterness can quietly begin taking root. Why is disappointment sometimes one of the greatest tests of spiritual maturity?
11. Someone read **Matthew 27:50-51**. The temple curtain tearing represented open access to God through Christ. How should having direct access to God shape the way Christians live differently from the world?
12. Familiarity can slowly erode reverence. Why is it possible to become so familiar with church, Scripture, worship, or spiritual routines that awe for God slowly fades?
13. What are some warning signs that holy things are becoming ordinary or casual in someone's spiritual life?
14. Someone read **Malachi 2:6-7**. Priests were called to carry truth, influence people toward God, and live lives that reflected Him. What opportunities has God placed around you right now to represent Christ more intentionally?
15. Everyone influences somebody. Parents influence children. Friends influence friends. Culture influences people constantly. If someone closely observed your life for six months, what would they conclude matters most to you?
16. What did you do last week to be a blessing to someone? Share with the group. And what are you planning for this week?
