Let's Dig Deeper

Someone read **Matthew 6:25-34**. Spend some time and share some key words that spoke out to you while reading. What is it about those words that spoke to you?

1. What is one area of your life where you've wanted to grow for a long time? Why do you think lasting change has been difficult?
2. Read **Romans 8:29**. What does this passage reveal about God's ultimate goal for your life, and how is that different from the goals we often set for ourselves?
3. Why do you think it's possible to know a great deal about the Bible and still struggle to become more like Christ?
4. Think about someone who has had a lasting impact on your walk with Christ. What did God use that person to teach you that you probably couldn't have learned alone?
5. Read **Ephesians 4:11-16**. What stands out to you about Paul's description of spiritual maturity, and what does it suggest about the role of the church in our growth?
6. Our culture often celebrates independence and self-sufficiency. In what ways can those values quietly shape the way we approach our relationship with God?
7. When have you discovered that a difficult relationship ended up producing spiritual growth in your life instead of simply creating frustration?
8. Read **Galatians 6:2**. What keeps people from carrying one another's burdens, and what would it look like for a LifeGroup to actually live out this command?
9. Which "one another" command from Scripture do you find the most difficult to practice, and what does that reveal about your own heart?
10. Think about someone who occasionally tests your patience. How might your perspective change if you viewed that person as one of God's tools for shaping your character?

11. Read **Genesis 2:18**. Before sin entered the world, God declared that it was "not good" for man to be alone. What does that teach us about how God designed people to live?
12. What is the difference between attending church and truly belonging to a church family? How have you experienced both?
13. Read **Hebrews 10:24-25**. According to this passage, why is regularly gathering with other believers essential for spiritual growth instead of merely helpful?
14. Who is currently helping you become more like Jesus? If no one immediately comes to mind, what step could you take to change that?
15. As you think about the legacy you want to leave behind, what kind of person do you hope others become because God allowed you to invest in their lives?
16. What have you done this week to be a blessing to someone? Share.
