The Pastor's View

I've discovered there's no point in pining for something that's gone and won't return, but still I do miss the days when Christmas season started the day after Thanksgiving. Over the past fifteen or so years the Christmas season has crept up on Halloween, and this year I saw Christmas decorations out in some stores in September. That's just the way it is now.

But with this reality I want you to remember the why of the seasons we are approaching and celebrating.

For example the why of Thanksgiving is to give thanks to God for the blessings He gives us. This first occurred in the commonwealth of Virginia in 1607, and was the clear and stated point for this day set by President Washington for Thursday November 26th in 1789. In 1863 President Lincoln set the date for this thanksgiving as the last Thursday in November, and President Roosevelt signed the day into federal law as the fourth Thursday in November in 1942. We must not lose the day, nor the reason for it.

And in the busyness of the holidays, we must also hold onto the why of Christmas, which is that in the fullness of time, meaning God's good time, a savior was sent, to save the world from sin and death. Think about that for a minute: to be saved from sin and from death. Awesome does not begin to describe what God has done for us.

In the midst of all that the next two months brings, don't lose sight of the why, and think about what your response could be to God, who has truly given us grace upon grace

SAVE THE DATE—DECEMBER 24, 7PM AND 11PM

Christmas Eve candlelight services have been a cherished tradition for churches in the United States and around the world for many years.

This year will be no different, as First United Methodist Church of London plans special services to mark the coming of Christmas.

Our church has offered candlelight services for well over 100 years (possibly 200 years) – no one knows exactly how long, but the tradition of candlelight services itself traces back to Europe in the 1600s. It is a meaningful way to symbolize the light of Christ coming into the darkness in the world.

The advent wreath with the Christ candle in the center emulates the light of Christ. One candle of the advent wreath is lit each Sunday of December until the final one — the central Christ candle — is lit for the Christmas Eve candlelight service. The Advent candles represent hope, peace, joy and love.

Then we take that candle and light everyone's candle from that light, and you can see the light on the congregation's faces. The light of believers is magnified and has all the symbolism of light when Christ was born.

First United Methodist Church will have candlelight services at 7p.m and 11p.m
