The Week's Idea

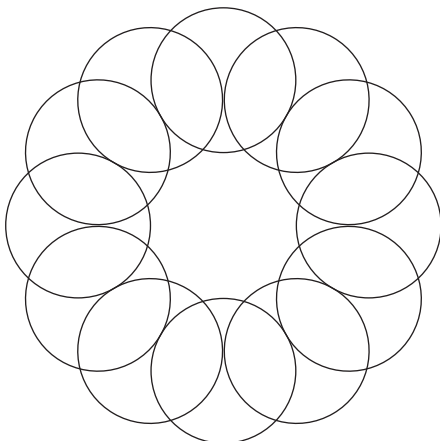


God has more for us. Not more busyness. Not more religious activity. More of Himself.

The vision is not a slogan. It is a prayer for the Spirit of God to bring gospel renewal to people and places.

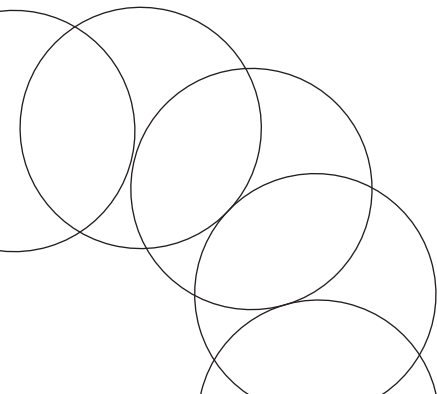
This week raises our eyes again: the more God has is ultimately God Himself.

2. When you hear "God has more," do you want more of God Himself or mostly more comfort, clarity, or control?

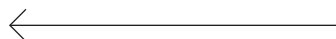
3. What person or place in your life needs gospel renewal, and what would it look like to pray with fresh faith?

Father, raise our eyes. Forgive us for settling. Fill us with all the fullness of God, and make us a church that can only be explained by Your presence. **Amen.**

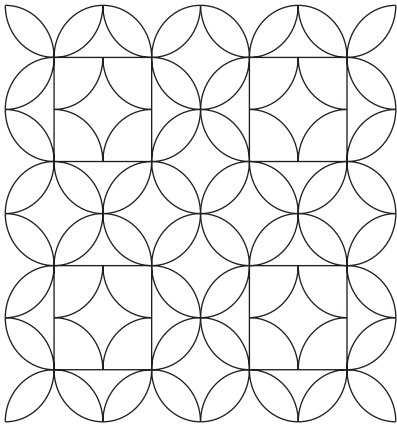
The Week's Idea ←

A disciple is a learner, an apprentice, a person learning Jesus—His heart, His yoke, His commands, His way of being human.

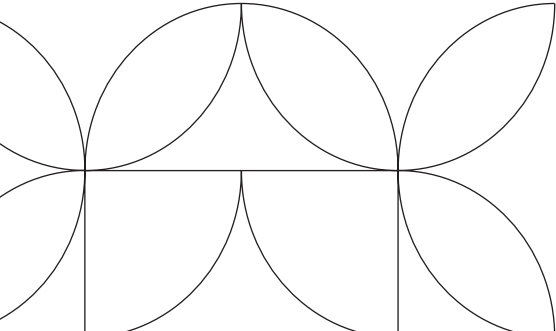
This happens in the church, not as solo spirituality. We are made and matured together.

Jesus, call us again. Make us more like You. Teach us to walk with You and with one another, for the sake of those You are sending us to love. **Amen.**

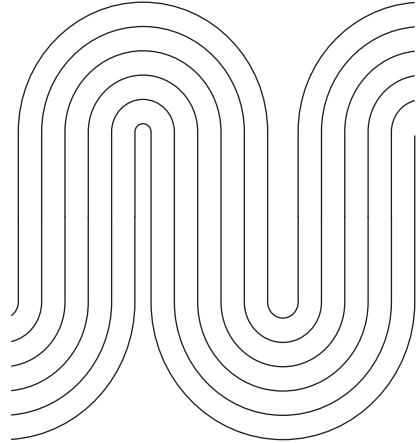
The Week's Idea ←

The Bible is not a pile of disconnected verses for religious people. It is the true story of God, the world, and our lives in Him.

Creation. Fall. Covenant. Christ. Church and Spirit. Restoration. The Bible locates our smaller stories inside God's larger story.

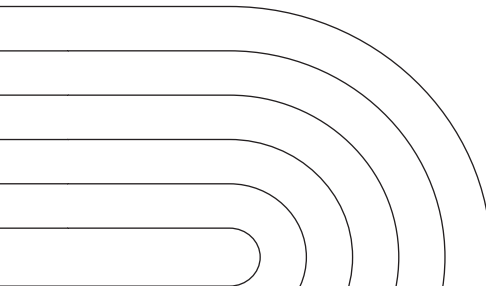
We want to know the Word of God so we can know the God of the Word - the living God who speaks, saves, forms, and sends.

Where This Meets Real Life ←

Everyone is being disciplined by a story. Success has a story. Anxiety has a story. Politics, pain, family history, and social media all tell us who we are and where hope is found. The Scriptures tell the truth. And the truth is not meant to merely inform us. The truth is meant to set us free.

slowly.

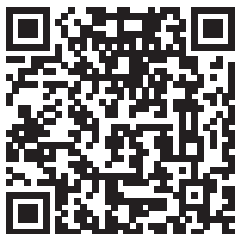
Ask: What is true?

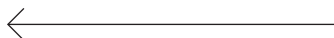


Questions to Consider

The Week's Idea

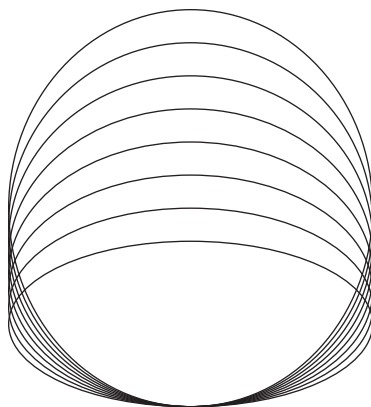


Theology means words about God. Everyone has theology. The question is whether what we believe is true, biblical, and integrated into real life.

Truth about God is not meant to stay in a classroom, notebook, or podcast queue. It is meant to shape how we suffer, repent, parent, work, rest, forgive, speak, and worship.

Good theology becomes whole-life discipleship. Head, heart, and hands.

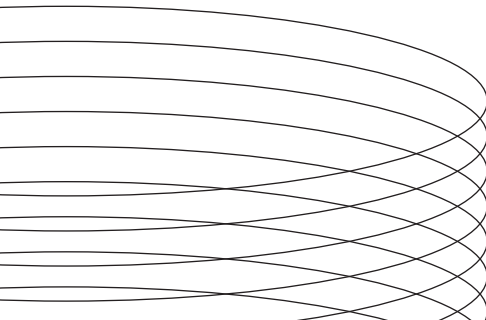
Theological Integration

God, make what we know of You true in us. Renew our minds, form our hearts, and teach us to walk in the way of Jesus. **Amen.**

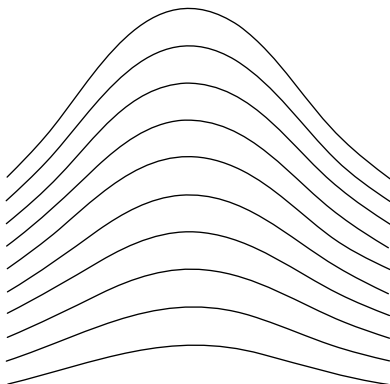
The Week's Idea ←

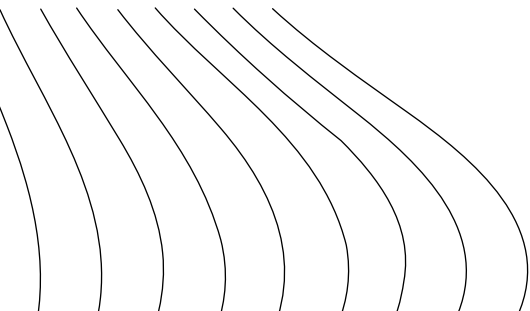


Where This Meets Real Life ←

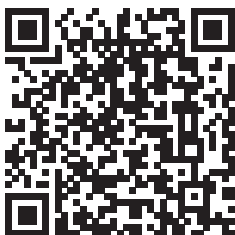
A Simple Practice

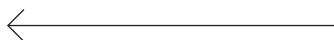


Questions to Consider

Father, make us hungry for You. Teach us to pray with honesty and faith. Build a culture of prayer in us that outlives us. **Amen.**

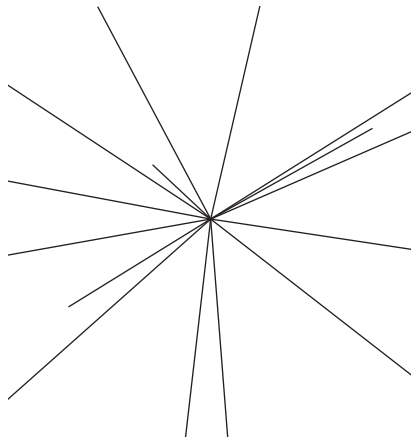
The Week's Idea ←

The gospel is not the doorway we leave behind after conversion. It is the river underneath the whole life of renewal.

We become like Christ as we remember and reapply what is already true of us in Him: accepted, adopted, forgiven, secure, sent.

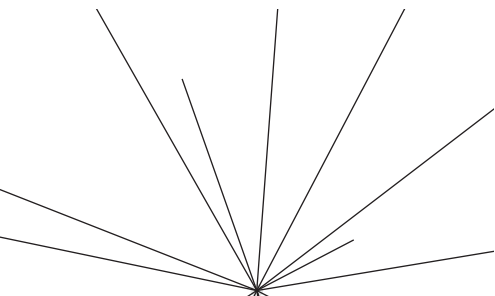
Renewal means honest confession and repentance, not to earn love, but because we are loved.

Where This Meets Real Life ←

Many of us believe grace in theory but live by performance in practice. We draw assurance from how well we are doing, how needed we feel, how together we look, or how little we failed. That is exhausting. The gospel brings us back to Jesus: His righteousness, His mercy, His life in us.

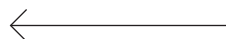


Though outwardly we are wasting away, inwardly we are being renewed day by day.

- 3.** Do you believe God loves you in Jesus before you improve?

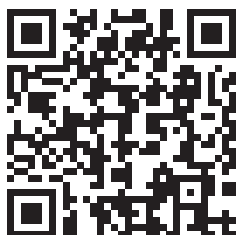
A Simple Practice

Jesus, renew us by Your gospel. Search us, forgive us, free us, and form us into people continually amazed by Your beauty and power. **Amen.**

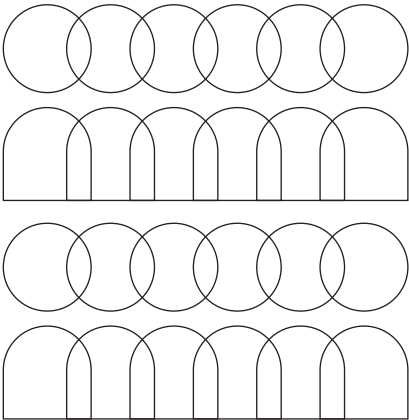
The Week's Idea ←

Doctrine and discipleship that never move us toward love of neighbor are not biblical discipleship.

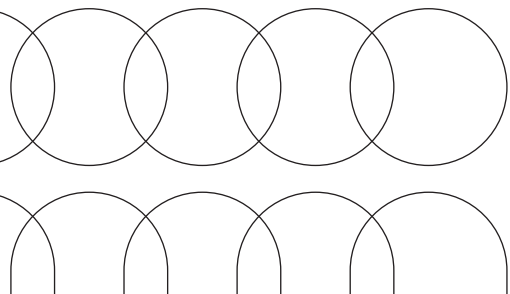
As people of sacrificial mission, we practice generosity, evangelism, and justice for the city and for the nations.

Churches, like people, naturally drift inward. Preferences get protected. Comfort becomes normal. But the heart of Jesus is to serve and not be served. He sends us with open hands, open mouths, and open lives so others can taste the goodness of God.

Questions to Consider

1. Where are you tempted to make church mostly about your comfort?
2. Who has God sent you to love, serve, bless, or tell about Jesus?
3. What would sacrifice look like this week with your time, talent, or treasure?

Choose one act of sacrificial mission this week: give generously, share the gospel, serve a neighbor, or take one concrete step of justice and mercy.

The Week's Idea

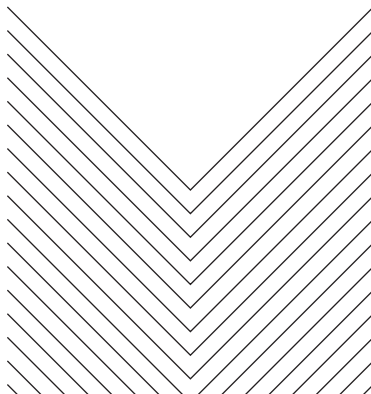


We can choose practices. We do not choose the valley. Suffering, disorientation, loss, grief, and wilderness come into our lives in ways we would never plan.

Any framework for real formation must help people walk there. The goal is not to explain everything, but to help us not lose heart.

The Shepherd does not hand us a map and leave. He gives us Himself. Even there. Especially there.

The Valley



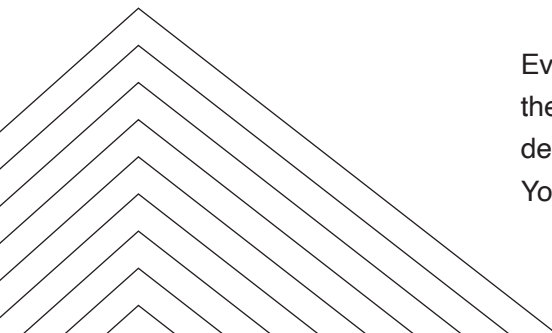
Where This Meets Real Life



Some of the most disorienting things in our lives become the places where Jesus forms us most deeply. That does not make grief small. It means the valley is not empty. Christ entered the deepest valley for us, and He walks with us through ours until every sad thing comes untrue.

Questions to Consider



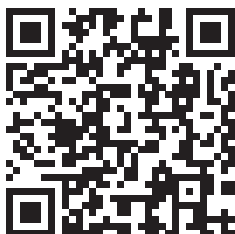
1. What valley are you in now, or still carrying with you?
2. What truth, practice, and people has God given so you do not walk alone?

Pray Psalm 23 slowly. Then tell one trusted person the truth about where you are. Do not over-spiritualize it. Do not rush past it. Let the Shepherd meet you there.

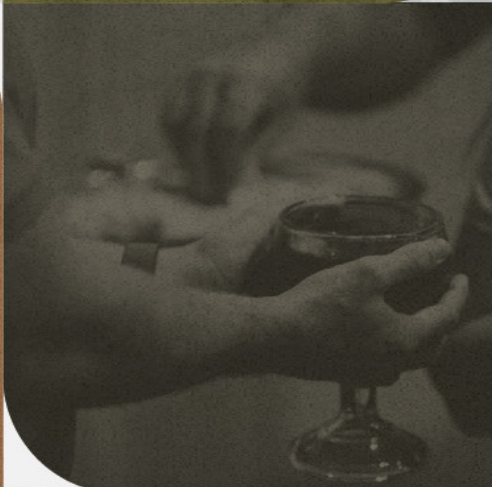
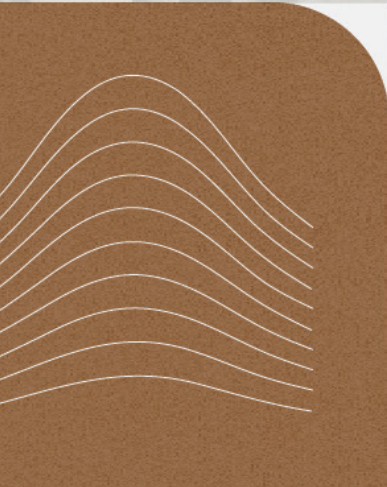
