RABBIT OR HARE? Montana supports an impressive variety of wild rabbits and hares thanks to its enormous range of habitats. Open prairie grasslands, sagebrush plains, mountain forests, river valleys, rocky

foothills, and snowy northern woodlands all create suitable environments for different species. Some rabbits remain common near ranches and rural roads, while others live deep inside forests or isolated western deserts where very few people ever notice them.

Wild rabbits and hares play an essential role in Montana ecosystems. Coyotes, bobcats, foxes, eagles, hawks, owls, badgers, mountain lions, and lynx all depend heavily on them as prey. Their populations influence predator movement, hunting success, and even vegetation growth patterns across the state.

Many people assume every rabbit in Montana belongs to the same species, but the differences between them are surprisingly dramatic. Some are compact cottontails that hide beneath shrubs, while others are large hares built for incredible speed across open country. One species even changes color completely during winter.

Understanding Montana’s rabbit species reveals how animals adapt to harsh winters, predators, altitude, and wide-open landscapes. Their survival strategies differ depending on where they live and how they avoid becoming food for larger predators.

The easiest way to identify Montana rabbits is by focusing on habitat, ear length, body size, tail appearance, and behavior. True rabbits usually appear compact with shorter legs and fluffy white tails, while hares tend to look larger, leaner, and faster.

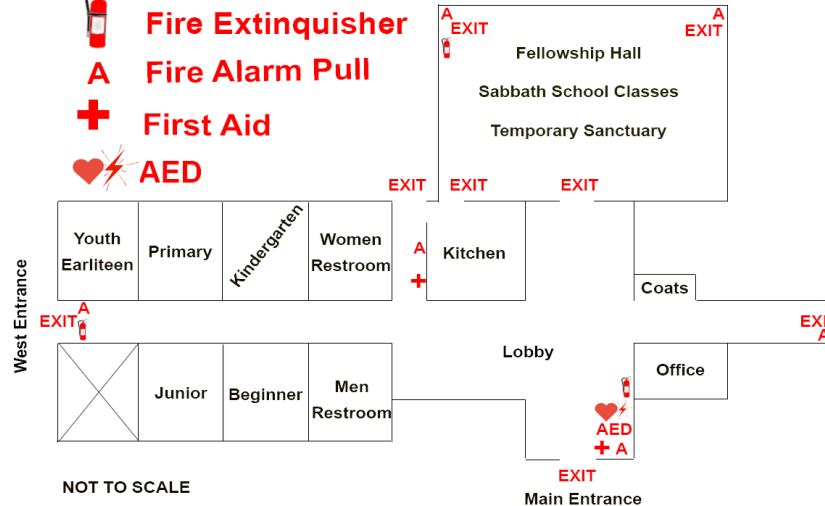
