E-GIVING



In order to set up e-giving, please use the QR code to the left or visit our website at www.redlionzion.com and follow the link on the homepage to sign into your ChurchTrac account with your email. Please note, you must be set up in our system, with an email listed, in order to sign in. If you are in our directory, or have given to us before, you are most likely already in our system and are able to follow the link to set up your giving from there. If not, please contact Shawn Stine at 717-880-5944.

Under Red Lion Zion, on the left of the screen, you will find three small lines. These bring up a menu. Click online giving. **** Please use a ACH/Debit option (routing/checking # only) as we are not accepting credit cards at this time.** This includes debit cards and credits, even if they are linked to your checking, as they cost us much more to process. We can't eliminate

the option to sign up that way, but ask that you do not use it. It is very important to make sure you sign up using your routing/checking info and not card info. To sign out, click only right side of the screen.

Stewardship Corner

The Stewardship Corner, from time-to-time, will provide ways to support our church. This note is to suggest the qualified charitable distribution or QCD. Do you have an IRA? Are you 70 1/2 years old or older? Did you know you can transfer from your IRA to a qualified charity, such as the church, tax-free? Normally, distributions from a traditional IRA are taxable when received. With a QCD, however, these contributions become tax-free as long as they are paid directly from the IRA to an eligible charity. Transferred amounts are not taxable, and no deduction is available for the transfer. The transfer may be considered part of your required minimum distribution (RMD). Should you be interested in learning more please call the church office or check with the holder of your IRA.

A Message from Pastor Delass

Dear Red Lion Zion Family,

Grace and peace to you as we step into the warmth and rhythm of the summer season!

The summertime often brings a change of pace. Schedules shift, families travel, and routines soften. Yet even as our calendars adjust, the presence of God remains steady and near. Having just come through the powerful celebration of Pentecost, we carry with us the fresh reminder that the Holy Spirit is alive, active, and moving in our everyday lives. The same Spirit that filled the upper room now fills our hearts with courage, wisdom, and holy fire.

As we transition into summer, we will **pause our weekly Bible Study gatherings until September**. This pause is not an ending, but a time to reflect on the rich season we shared together. For thirteen weeks during Bible Study with the Pastor, we explored the depth and beauty of **Faith**. Learning how profoundly present the Spirit of God is in our daily conversations, decisions, challenges, and victories. Those mornings and evenings were filled with insight, honesty, laughter, prayer, and growth. We were reminded that faith is not reserved for Sunday worship but is lived out Monday through Saturday in the practical places of life.

Each week, we are discovering that God's Word meets us right where we are and leads us forward with grace and direction.

As we carry the momentum of Pentecost into the summer months, may we hold tightly to the promise of *Romans 8:11*: "And if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, He... will also give life to your mortal bodies because of His Spirit who lives in you." This is resurrection power still at work within us. This is the holy fire we carry into June and July.

Even as Bible Study pauses, our spiritual growth does not. Summer becomes an opportunity to practice what we have learned to spend quiet time with the Lord, to be present with our families, to worship consistently, and to remain sensitive to the leading of the Holy Spirit in our daily lives.

Red Lion Zion, this is a season to live out our faith with joy, confidence, and expectation. The Spirit is moving. The Word is alive. And God is with us in every step we take.

I look forward to continuing our worship together each Sunday and returning to Bible Study in the fall with renewed energy and anticipation for what God will do next.

HOW IS YOUR FURNACE?: Our sanctuary furnace is more than 60 years old! The last few years we have been blessed to start it when need ed, but it is tired and inefficient. The Board has designated replacing the furnace as the priority on our asset reserve list. The cost is \$8,000 and through your support and prudent planning we have \$5,000 earmarked for this project. Therefore, we are requesting second-mile gifts to fund the \$3,000 difference to complete this project. The new furnace will be more efficient, resulting in lower gas bills which approached \$1,500/month this winter. If you are able to contribute, please do so by June 30th.
