## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

**Week 42**

1. In Luke 8:26–39, what stands out to you about the way Jesus moves toward the man everyone else has moved away from? What does this reveal about Jesus' character?
2. The man's life had been completely changed by his encounter with Jesus. What are some ways your life, priorities, relationships, or identity have changed since following Jesus?
3. If you had to describe your "before Jesus" and "after Jesus" in a few sentences, what would you say? What is different because of following Him?
4. What do we learn from Jesus' willingness to go to a place and a person others avoided? In your life, who are those that come to mind? Or places?

### Heart- Level Reflection Questions

1. The man wanted to go with Jesus, but Jesus gave him a different assignment: "Tell how much God has done for you." What are some simple, natural ways we can tell people what Jesus has done for us without feeling like we have to have all the answers?
2. How does remembering what Jesus has done for us—including His sacrifice on the cross—change the way we live and respond to others? What happens when we forget?
3. The man's transformation became visible to everyone around him. What evidence of Jesus' work should become visible in your life? Think about our words, attitudes, relationships, forgiveness, generosity, and treatment of others.
4. Who is one person in your life who may feel overlooked, rejected, or far from God? What might it look like this week to move toward that person with the same compassion Jesus showed in this passage?
