Ukraine Refugees Travel Approved Expected arrival by end of April

Ihor Pavlovich Tokarev, his wife Lyubov, and children Ramir and Davyd, ages 7 and 10, have been approved to

travel to the US. We are now working on the arrangements for travel and accommodations when they arrive. The application has taken a little longer than necessary as I mixed up the name when entering the information on the form. Corrections have been made to make sure names are the same as their passport.



Many have volunteered household furnishing for the Tokarev family. When they arrive we hope to have filled their refrigerator, kitchen with basic necessities, bathroom and bedding items. They will need a prepaid cell phone to keep contact with immigration and family. If you can donate any of these items, gift cards, or perhaps purchase script through Grace for HyVee, County Fair, or Walmart, that would be very much appreciated.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I google it – What does scripture say about helping your neighbor? It reference 51 Bible verses. Of course, there is Mark 12: 31 "The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than this."

Isaiah 1: 17 tells us, "Learn to do right; seek justice. Defend the oppressed. Take up the cause of the fatherless; plead the case of the widow."

And there is Galatians 6: 10 that says, "Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers."

Let us do good, that is the meaning of Grace... and Grace Lutheran.

As I put together the calendar and get the newsletter ready to print, I see all the things you as Grace Lutheran are doing for your neighbor and all the ways you are open and welcoming to invite others into the church.

April will be a busy month, but really it seems every month is busy at Grace. I'm so proud of you all. On Palm Sunday, there will be an Easter Egg Hunt for the youth. Some thought it a wonderful opportunity to invite our neighbors to come join us, especially with all the new apartments. So they put together the means and their creative ideas for a postcard to go to all boxholders in the 4 zones around the church for it and worship on Easter Sunday.

Each week we host the Watertown Banquet where many come for a meal and to socialize. We hosted the Ecumenical Community Lenten service this year to get it started once more. It would have been so easy to just say we can wait until next year. But we didn't. We put in the extra effort to make sure it happened even though we served more times than usual. Next year there is the promise by others to be back on schedule.

Grace held their annual Spring Craft/Vendor Fair even with uncooperative weather. The Jamboree will be held even though we aren't raising money for a major roof project. You see, it's not about the money or raising the funds. It's about our neighbor and being neighborly.

Neighborly is having or showing qualities of being friendly, kind, and helpful.

During the next month we will open our doors and arms to refugees from Ukraine. When I read the stories online of request to please help, my heart breaks. They have no home to return to. Their cities flattened and taken over. They have lost loved ones or must leave them behind.

I think of the pioneers who were so brave to set out for unknown places leaving behind family and friends for a better life. It was not easy and I'm sure they had anxieties and fears, just as these new refugees have.

But I remember those seven men who decided there should be a Lutheran church in Watertown and met to organize it. They did not have English as their first language. They did not know how it would come about or what the outcome would be. But through the years and many innovative ideas to reach out and help their neighbor, it grew; through radio broadcast and television shows, drive-in services and Easter services filling the Armory three times over, so all could hear the proclamation. From the idea of a Luther Hospital in 1909 that developed and was renamed Memorial Hospital which merged with St Anne's Hospital and later became Prairie Lakes Hospital, to hosting Las Posadas each December and Spanish speaking services at Christmas and Easter, Grace has been a neighbor to many.

Even sponsoring refugees is nothing new as in 1978 two refugee families from Viet Nam and 1990, Polish refugees were sponsored by Grace. Now, you have stepped up in trust and faith to be a neighbor to Ihor Pavlovich Tokarev and his family as well as Vasyl Molod and maybe more.

"If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on them, how can the love of God be in that person?" 1 John 3: 17

So often I see the love of God in you Grace Lutheran. Helping the neighbor is and always has been how we live in community, and you have demonstrated that over and over again through your faith and obedience to God.

Deuteronomy 22: 1-4 tells us, ""You shall not see your neighbor's ox or his sheep going astray and ignore them. You shall take them back to your neighbor. And if he does not live near you and you do not know who he is, you shall bring it home to your house, and it shall stay with you until your neighbor seeks it. Then you shall restore it to him. And you shall do the same with his donkey or with his garment, or with any lost thing of your neighbor's, which he loses and you find; you may not ignore it. You shall not see your neighbor's donkey or his ox fallen down by the way and ignore them. You shall help him to lift them up again."

You have been a blessing to so many in the community of God and the community of Watertown, SD. I look forward to this new work of neighborliness we are pursuing, together.

Members of Grace Lutheran have always loved their neighbor as themselves, and I am so proud and honored to be your pastor as you reach out to your new neighbor and lift them up again.

Minutes of the Grace Lutheran Council Meeting on Thursday March 9th, 2023

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday March 9th, 2023 at 6pm with Mark Briley Presiding. Also present was LeRoy Bullis, Kelly Evjen, Terra Koistinen, Travis Schulz, Lindsey Moeller, Dylan Jordan, Adam Wientjes, Kayla Mohling, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett, and Kat Anderson. Absent were Steve Schlenner. Sherry Jongeling, Marian Raml, Ted Frost, Gena Urevig, and Ronda Lorenz. Guests were Wil Morlock and Rick Brownell.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Kayla Mohling and seconded by Kelly Evjen. Motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes for the February 9th, 2023 meeting was made by Travis Schulz and seconded by Kelly Evjen. Motion carried.

Items:

Financial Report – Kat Anderson reported the total monthly income to the general fund was \$17,667.80, the weekly giving average was \$4,261, and the average weekly worship attendance was 66 for the month of February. The utility bill has been higher this month as well as snow removal. A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Dylan Jordan and seconded by Adam Wientjes. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett continues to visit care centers and assisted living homes. She had 4 marriage counseling sessions as well as preparing for First Communion classes that began in March. Ash Wednesday was cancelled due to weather. A mailer is going out to invite the community to a Palm Sunday easter egg hunt as well as the Easter services in English and Spanish.

Old Business:

Ukraine Refuge Sponsorship – We are awaiting the arrival of the family from Ukraine and some household donations have come in.

140th Celebration (Sept. 16th & 17th 2023) – Sherry was absent & unable to update

Annual Committee Reports and revised descriptions – Committee description book is now complete.

Utilization of Choir/Multipurpose Room – Council would like congressional input before a decision is made to fill in the pit.

Youth & Family Director update – Pastor Cheryl had 3 phone interviews and moved 2 of them forward for a 2nd interview.

Constitution – Mark Briley will check the procedure to see what the next steps are for ratification.

New Business:

The resignation of Breanna Hemiller – Communications, was turned in and effective immediately.

Foundation Grants- Wil Morlock shared the grants that were approved at the March 6th Foundation meeting. Wil also explained what the Foundation does for the sake of the new council members. Up to 25% of the funds can be used for the church infrastructure, 25% can be put towards education, 25% towards ELCA Benevolence, and 25% on community projects.

New Church Management and Accounting software – Kat Anderson presented a new software that will be a welcome update to the current program that is being used. Adam Wientjes made a motion to approve moving forward with the purchase. Kayla Mohling seconded. Motion passed.

Preschool – Updating the third signer to Kayla Mohling. Signature cards needed to be updated at the bank and it would be nice to have someone on the preschool board. Dylan Jordan made a motion and Travis Schulz seconded. Motion passed.

A motion was made by Dylan Jordan to require itemized receipts for reimbursement requests from preschool personnel. Kelly Evjen seconded. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Dylan Jordan to eliminate the use of personal Venmo transactions through the pre-

Congregational Query

Grace Lutheran Council is seeking your opinion on repurposing the choir room to a Multi-purpose Room. Estimates have been received to fill-in the tiered area making the floor one level. Tiered seating was useful when Grace had a large choir, and all members needed an unobstructed view of the director. We no longer have a large choir and seldom use the room for choir practice.

Reasons for this repurposing are:

Liability One person has slipped over the edge of the tiered seating area and taken by ambulance to the emergency.

Placing a railing around each tier for safety would limit the use of the room even more.

Currently two TOPs groups meet in this room. Some have difficulty walking and could slip.

Anyone using the area would have less chance to trip up and down the tier layers.

Usability: The room could be better utilized without the tiered steps.

If repurposed, more meetings could take place in the room. A larger room provides opportunities for larger meetings, Bible Studies, craft activities, etc. without setting up Fellowship Hall.

Brides want a room with more lighting for pictures as they prepare for their wedding. The basement does not have the lighting they desire. An option is to allow use of the chapel for better lighting which requires removal and return of chairs.

The Watertown Fruit by Grace refrigerators could be moved into the room and out of the hallway with areas for product and storage.

He will be staying with Pastor Cheryl and husband Scott at Wilmot for the first few weeks until employment is obtained. There are other singe people or just couples seeking sponsorship. If any-

If you would like your child to have this instruction but erbs 22: 6 the normal fall through winter to spring period does


not fit your schedule or family dynamics, summer classes are available to assist you in achieving this important responsibility and time of learning for young people 7th thru 12th grade.
