Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Stewardship is one of the least favorite things to talk about in the church, but we must.

It is defined as the careful and responsible management or supervision of something entrusted to one's care, from two Greek words which means household or estate and to arrange or manage. A steward is not the owner of the household, but manager of what is entrusted to them.

That is what the congregation of Grace Lutheran is, not the owners but the entrusted servant of resource for ministry: the creation, gifts and talents, money, time, and the gospel have all been given to you for God's purposes. You are told in Deuteronomy 8: "17Do not say to yourself, "My power and the might of my own hand have gotten me this wealth." 18But remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, so that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your ancestors, as he is doing today."

Another misunderstood word is ministry. In both the Greek and Hebrew it means servant, not just the pastor. So each week as we give thanks and dedicate our offerings to God for the mission and ministry of Grace Lutheran, it is about how you serve God and His mission for you.

Jesus gives us several parable about stewardship Each of the synoptic gospels has the story of the rich man Jesus told to go and sell all his possession and give to the poor... saying "23Truly I tell you, it will be hard for a rich person to enter the kingdom of heaven. 24Again I tell you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." (Mat 19:23-24) and how we are to use our resources in parables like: the talents (Matthew 25:14-30); the wicked tenant farmers (Matthew 21: 33-46); and that of the unrighteous steward (Luke 16: 1-13).

Throughout scriptures, people were taught to tithe. Tithe is a Hebrew word that means tenth. To give 10 percent of your income back to the temple (the church): (Abraham) Genesis 14: 20, (Moses) Numbers 18: 26 and 2 Chronicles 31:5. To give your tithe faithfully is trusting God will provide for you.

And there is another parable less often read of the Minas (Luke 19: 12-26) where Minas means time... to be good stewards of your time, the one thing all receive equally but do not use the same.

Recently the Finance and Stewardship Committee has been meeting to find ways to increase the offering given to the general fund of the church. We have gone through a fund-raising project to raise money for a new roof in just a year and a half, a great accomplishment.

During this time, the offerings to the general fund have been going down. It could be due to people putting money into the project, the decreased attendance at worship could be due to the COVID lock-down, or people creating a bad habit not coming. There have also been those who stopped attending when a certain pastor left. On top of all this, inflation of course is not helping the situation.

Peter writes: "¹⁰Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received. ¹¹Whoever speaks must do so as one speaking the very words of God; whoever serves must do so with the strength that God supplies, so that God may be glorified in all things through Jesus Christ. To him belong the glory and the power forever and ever. Amen." (1Pe 4)

Let me be clear: Bad habits can be broken, often they are just excuses. The project is over and there is a great need to fund the church. And worship is not about a pastor. You attend to hear the word of God.

In a book, *It's Not Your Parents' Offering Plate: A New Vision for Financial Stewardship*, by J. Clif Christopher, he makes the point we have to change the way we see people give to the church. We need to show how their gift will have impact and play a significant part in the life and health of the church. People want to see the benefit it produces.

This was evident in giving toward the roof fund. People knew where it was going and what it would be used for. But you can't produce more benefits for the people without more people to do the work. That includes volunteers, and in January, a decision was made to call another intern or part-time pastor, which requires a salary.

It may seem like the wrong way to go about making an impact or providing a benefit to members and prospective members by adding a financial burden onto a dwindling revenue stream, but without it, many things are being left undone. When contacts are not made and a pastor or deacon is less visible, people more easily slip through the cracks and find other places to go and things to support.

As we reimagine Grace Lutheran, getting committees up and going, we need new people to serve. As we look for a revival at Grace Lutheran, we need people to give their financial support, even in times of economic slowdown. As we renew Grace Lutheran's mission and ministry for the next 140 years, we need to find new ways to be the church and serve the new face of our community.

So today, stop and think about what difference your faith has made in your life, how it has helped you through major challenges. With that in mind, would you pray for Grace Lutheran and the ministry (service) of it. Would you pray for members to return to worship, to be good stewards of their time and talents to volunteer for service at Grace, and to give more generously of their resources to provide for leaders.

And - How can you tithe of your first fruits, to increase the revenue source at Grace Lutheran?

Where "God's Grace is Experienced Daily!"

A confirmation mentor plays an important part in the spiritual formation of an adolescent student during their faith formation years. This formal mentor relationship will take place several times a year while the student is enrolled in the 2-year confirmation program at Grace Lutheran Church. These meeting or activities occur in an informal setting but may build a relationship lasting a lifetime.

Along with the parents and pastor, the mentor will form an important connection with the student to encourage and support them in their learning.

Meeting times are flexible, and mentors will decide together what works best for schedules. Mentors are encouraged to meet no less than 4 times a year and not more than once a month. Meetings can include: to go out to eat together, attending a sporting event together, go to the movies together, or just hang out to talk. Whatever the two determine is how time together will be spent to build a relationship.
