Season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday begins our forty-day journey towards Easter on Wednesday, February 22, 2023. Services will be held at Grace Lutheran at Noon and once again at 7 pm in the evening with a Spanish Speaking service at 8 pm. All services will include Holy Communion and Imposition of Ashes.

Our Ash Wednesday text from Matthew 6: 1-6, 16-21 provides a lesson on the practice of faith, as Jesus emphasizes that spiritual devotion must not be done for show but through a right relationship with God.

Lenten services continue our journey at 7 pm each Wednesday evening until Holy Week. The theme for this year's Lenten serves is "At the Name of Jesus" based on Philippians 2: 5-11.

The text will point the congregation toward our annual celebration beginning on Passion/Palm Sunday April 2nd. Each week we will reflect on the text for a deeper, richer understanding of the passion of Christ, enlightening your awareness as Jesus enters the holy city and you hear the shouts of "Hosanna!" on the first day of Holy Week, then just days later hear the cries of "Crucify!"

The significance of this emotional week and the theological themes presented during the weeks leading up to it, provides a powerful backdrop for the coming celebration of the Three Days and Easter.

Weekly themes beginning March 1st include Christ emptied and humbled himself; Christ became obedient; At the name of Jesus all knees shall bow; Every tongue confesses Jesus; and Let the same mind be in you.

Lenten services will be held at Grace Lutheran at 7 pm during the five Wednesday evening of March.

All are welcome to attend and reflect.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Sunday, January 29th was certainly a big day at Grace Lutheran as we conducted our annual meeting, elected council members, held a potluck, and said farewell to Cindy Vander Leest upon her retirement. I was so proud of everyone who made the effort to come even though the weather was intensely cold, and those who attended by ZOOM due to distance

and illness. Your efforts were very much appreciated.

The events of the day were not unusual, but demonstrated the changes taking place at Grace Lutheran, as in churches across the country. Change is coming and necessary.

Change is hard for people as it pushes you out of a comfortable way of life that is simple and easy to maneuver. Change is a constant in life, for only Jesus does not change, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever," (Heb 13:8) which we can be thankful for.

Isaiah 43 tells us change can be a positive thing, "¹⁸Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. ¹⁹I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."

Right now you may feel we are in the wilderness with so many good and faithful people who have retired from the office and new faces on the council. It's hard to perceive how it can be different or a new thing because we dwell on what it has been. But God promises you a new thing.

According Amber Rose Monaco writing a blog online for Huffpost, new things help us grow as we learn from new opportunities and experiences. We will learn who we are as Grace Lutheran, not the Grace Lutheran that was 140 years ago, or 50 years ago, or even 10 years ago. We will learn who we are today, which can be exciting and valuable.

This can be seen in our new council. We have some faithful council members who have come back, some long time members who have never served before, and some members who just became members of Grace Lutheran. It will be exciting to hear their hopes for this family of faith and what it means to them to look for a future here.

Monaco states, change makes you more flexible and adaptable. Wow, did we ever find that out two months after I arrived at Grace and COVID shut us down. We had to be flexible and adapt to a very different way of proclaiming the gospel and do it fast. It was challenging but we never missed a service and thrived with online attendance higher than we had seen for some time.

She also states, change allows new opportunities and experiences which helps us see and develop new possibilities. We did this by holding dance class and a jamboree to bring new people into our space. Now we have the Watertown Fruit by Grace, a useful program for those who are in need of fresh fruit at a wholesale price as well as a revenue source for the church. I've written before how the offering plate will not be the main source of income for the church of the future and this program shows how we can adjust to that change in a way that supports community and the budget.

The purpose statement of Grace Lutheran is: "This congregation... is a people created by God in Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit, called and sent to bear witness to God's creative, redeeming and sanctifying activity in the world."

The activities of the world have changed, God has not. He still empowers us by the Holy Spirit, calls and sends us to bear witness... to God's creative, redeeming and sanctifying activity in the world. Not only inside the church. Not without innovation and creativity.

We are called... sent... to be witness to His creative ways... To me that means seeing what God is up to and joining in and hearing God to be about His work in new and changing ways.

For Grace Lutheran, this is an exciting time for, "Even though we speak in this way, beloved, we are confident of better things in your case, things that belong to salvation. ¹⁰For God is not unjust; he will not overlook your work and the love that you showed for his sake in serving the saints, as you still do." (Heb 6)

As we go forward together, I pray you will continue to hold Grace Lutheran in your prayers and look for new and creative opportunities "Where God's Grace is Experience Daily."

Together, we can handle the changes God has planned for us as He tells us, "11For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. 12Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you." (Jer 29)

Let's look forward to all that the Lord has planned for us.

Minutes of the Grace Lutheran Council Meeting on Thursday January 12th, 2023

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday January 12, 2023 at 6pm with Rick Brownell Presiding. Also present was LeRoy Bullis, Rebecca Anderson-Brasel, Sherry Jongeling Kayla Mohling, Marian Raml, Ted Frost, Gena Urevig, Mark Briley, Kelly Evjen, Ronda Lorenz, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett, Cindy Vander Leest and Kat Anderson. Absent were Paul Henrichs, Geri Mohror, Adam Wientjes, and Steve Schlenner. Guests were Linda Williams and Darlene Bressen.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Rhonda Lorenz and seconded by Sherry Jongeling. Motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes for the December 18, 2022 meeting was made by Gena Urevig and seconded by Kayla Mohling. Motion carried.

Items:

- Financial Report Cindy Vander Leest reported the monthly income to the general fund was \$24,0831, the
 weekly average giving was \$5,891, and the weekly worship attendance was 102 for the month of December.
 A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Mark Briley and seconded by Marian
 Raml. Motion carried.
- 2. Pastor's Report Pastor Cheryl performed one baptism and one wedding in December, along with Los Posadas, Christmas Eve, and Christmas Day services. Pastor reminded everyone that our church ministry belongs to all of us as a congregation family and we should be inviting people to come to church with us to learn about Jesus' love for us. She also noted the Prairie Coteau Youth Gathering was cancelled due to lack of participation from other churches. The annual meeting will be Sunday January 29th following a 10am worship service where the children are singing. Following the meeting there will be a potluck to honor Cindy Vander Leest as she is retiring and Kat Anderson is taking over the business administration position. The FCC is created a ruling that would make it harder for religious organizations to broadcast on the radio. She signed a petition on the church's behalf to send it to court. The Jamboree will be April 16, 2023 and we will host the Community Lent Services this year. All services are in March on Wednesdays at Noon.

Old Business:

- 1. Ukraine Refuge Sponsorship Pastor Cheryl reported on the Watertown Ukrainian Refugee Effort meeting that she attended in Watertown on January 3, 2023. It was a sponsor training and education event. Watertown is planning on 1,000 refugees in the city. Translators are ready and the schools are preparing. Darlene Bressen and Linda Williams were also present to share. Darlene shared that they refugees can work and drive as soon as they come to us and other assistance will be available through Lutheran Social Services, Freedoms Haven for New Americans Workforce, and other government programs. She shared that they will most likely need clothing, housing, furnishings, food, and help filling out applications to send their children to school, apply for jobs, etc. Linda Williams voiced her concern for the refugees. Most speak English. Women and children were the first to flee. Local businesses are willing to employ refugees. Pastor Cheryl stated that there have been over \$17,000 in donations to the church designated towards Ukraine efforts. Gina Urevig motioned to open a bank account designated to Ukraine Refugee Efforts and a letter of support to be written. Sherry Jongeling seconded. Motion passed. A committee on Refugee Sponsorship will be formed at a later date.
- 2. 140th Celebration (Sept. 16th & 17th 2023) Sherry Jongeling shared that a man in Minnesota is making crosses by hand and showed one to the council. She asked to get a quote from the man for gifts for the 140th.
- 3. Annual Committee Reports are Due Now as of Thursday all reports have been turned in to the office.
- 4. Draft/Proposed Mission Plan Cindy Vander Leest presented changes. Mark Briley motioned to approve submitting to congregation at annual meeting. Sherry Jongeling seconded. Motion approved.
- 5. Committee reports and revised descriptions The Call Committee will need to contact the Synod and let

Watertown Fruit Program by Grace



Geri Mohror was at the table for the Watertown Fruit by Grace displaying a large variety of dried fruits, nuts, grains and cardies. These items are on sale whenever the office open.

Our program has had a wonderful start – thanks to the support from the Grace congregation! Besides selling the dried fruit and nuts a couple times between services, I've also participated in a vendor fair and we've had good support from groups that use our building. As of the end of December, our sales were \$1,771! With those sales. I've had to re-stock several items. which I'm happy to do!

I'm currently researching the possibility of adding some candy to our product offerings – hopefully within the next month. Watch for some great Valentine specials!!

I had hoped to offer the opportunity to order strawberries in February, but the broker is requiring me to order 3 pallets – or 300 flats of strawberries – because of the cost of freight. I don't think we would be able to sell that many, although fresh strawberries in February sounds really good!

I should be hearing soon about another fresh fruit opportunity – citrus fruits, pears, apples, pineapples, and meat snacks. Those orders will be taken in February, with delivery in March. I don't have any more details than that at this time.

The fresh fruit program will get a good start in the summer. From Hope for Life records, these are the timeframes and the fruits available:


June – cherries (Bing & Rainier), apricots, and blueberries

July – peaches, nectarines, and blueberries

August – peaches, nectarines, blueberries, applies, pears, prunes, and plums

Generally, 200+ boxes of fruit are sold each time, so I will need help unloading the fruit and then selling and loading when customers pick up their orders. This first year of selling the dried fruit

and nuts and the fresh fruit will be a learning experience, but if we can net \$10,000 in profit, it will be worth it.

Community Ecumenical Lenten services at Grace Lutheran

The Watertown Ministerial Association has once again organized the noon Community Ecumenical Lenten service which will begin March 1st with the theme *United in Christ* based on Psalm 133: 1 "How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" Grace Lutheran will be the host each week this year for the 12:05 worship services and luncheon during Lent.

Offerings from the service will be donated to the One Roof Program, a fund established at the Salvation Army and used to help in financial crisis or for individuals in need. Due to the extremely harsh weather in December, their Red Kettle offerings were less than usual and this will provide assistance for their local programs.

All churches and individuals can send money to Red Roof fund at any time. Many local churches regularly give to the fund and direct individuals to the Salvation Army who then provides assistance based on rules and the fraud alerts they have in place.

Outreach Committee Mission of the Month for February is HOPE IN GOD A Ministry of Divine Providence of South Dakota

A small group of women establish a Christian-based network of women survivors of child sexual abuse in June 2016 to provide spiritual and emotional support and increase community awareness of the prevalence and adverse life-long effects of child sexual abuse. In 2017, Hope In God became one-of-four ministries of Divine Providence of South Dakota, existing to lead all people, especially those wounded by child sexual abuse and sexual assault into a relationship with Jesus Christ and strengthen churches in Northeast South Dakota.

Based on Acts 1:6-8, their cause is to help victims become survivors and thrivers, going from wounded to wounded warrior, from victim to witness, and martyr for a cause larger than self.

In Act, Jesus responds to their question "Lord will you at this time restore the Kingdom to Israel?" by saying no one knows the day or the hour, "But YOU will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you and YOU will be my WITNESSES in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to ends of the earth." In other words, Jesus is telling the disciples they will be the ones to restore the Kingdom; receiving power to continue his work and become witnesses—his hands, his feet, his voice not only in Jerusalem, but everywhere. Jesus was not only speaking to his disciples then but he is also speaking to us, now.

We learn to change, we allow the Lord to transform us into the people he created us to be and it all begins when we step out from the shadows and trust God. We "Hope In God."

Ukrainian Refugee Sponsorship account available

The Grace Council approved an independent account and letter of support as a Sponsor for a Ukrainian Refugee. Your donations can now be made to this Refugee fund at Grace Lutheran Church, 202 2nd St SE, Watertown, SD. Letters of support have been requested to accompany the application as work continues on the application process.

Volunteers to assist in this endeavor upon their arrival are also required. Sponsors create the support systems that ensure newcomers can thrive. Members of Grace Lutheran, other churches, members of the community, and neighbors from this and surrounding communities can assist as people start on a long, difficult, and exciting journey in a new environment.

Ukrainian's coming to the U.S. must have a sponsor. Lutheran Social Service and Codington Country Social Services will provide many programs of assistance. Aid is also available for food, housing, and education as well as Federal Refugee Resettlement benefits and Refugee Medical Assistance.

Volunteers will help beneficiaries

(Ukraine refugees) apply for critical documents for life in the U.S. including Social Security cards, State IDs, and U.S. Drivers' License. Beneficiaries are allowed to work as soon as they arrive, and their Ukrainian driver's license will be valid. Help with job applications is another area volunteers can assist in; open up a new bank account and assist in applying for Employment Authorization - all critical steps to establishing a stable foothold in their new home.

Newcomers may need help applying for public benefits and services available to them in Codington County, including schools for children, educational opportunities, and career training.

Beneficiaries will need financial help when they first arrive as they work to rebuild their lives. Donated items of furniture, household supplies, clothing and even transportation can assist in resettlement.

While the Declaration of Financial Support provided in the application is not legally binding and there are no specific required amount sponsors must dedicate, sponsor should do what's right and plan to

raise at least \$3,000 for each person sponsored. This money will help the family get settled in the first 90 days after their arrival in the United States.

The statewide "Freedom's Haven for New Americans Workforce" has set a goal of 1,000 Ukrainians for Watertown, SD. With approximately 7 million refugees are already in Poland, Germany, and other European countries the need is great as they are running out of places to turn to.


