Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Ash Wednesday came and went with a snowstorm cancelling all activities for the day. Having been sick and stranded at home, there was nothing I could do to change the situation.

For many it was just another blizzard that shut down roads and kept people home. But for some, there was a sense of loss or missing something meaningful for their Lenten journey.

Ash Wednesday is more than just putting ashes on the forehead to show you are a believer. It is a physical feeling, an expression of repentance and a reminder of how we have sinned and fall short of the God's desire for His creatures. The sense of ashes rubbed across the brow is humbling. It helps us feel subservient to a higher being, our Lord and Savior, reminding us, we are helpless to save ourselves.

Not everyone likes that, to feel subservient. But that is what we must admit to. We are sinners, desperately in need of forgiveness because we just can't seem to get it right, to be sinless. No one can. To admit we are sinners, we understand we are human, and since Adam, all humankind sins.

The sense of ashes spread across the forehead is a reminder, we are mere mortals, "from dust you have come, and to dust you will return."

Again, not something most of us want to think about, but the consequence of sin is death.

All these feelings and emotions help us to "get into" Lent, making us aware of ourselves and our need for Christ Jesus. As we enter the Lenten season, we take time to remember how we are bound to this evil that comes out of us even when we try hard not to let it. Then we can humbly draw closer to God, seek His forgiveness through Christ, and appreciate the gift we have been given of grace and mercy through Christ death on the cross.

Lent is a time when we contemplate the fact that we are helpless and can do nothing to deserve forgiveness or salvation. As we take the extra time to attend Lenten services and hear the good news of what Christ has done for us, to suffer and die a horrendous death in our place, we take time to seriously consider our bad habits and any particular evil behaviors we may have.

There are many traditions during Lent to help with our repentance and preparation for Easter. Many consider fasting, which teaches us how to have self-control over a sin. Prayer is another Lenten traditions to practice, whether with fasting or without. Taking an additional time of day to stop and pray about our weakness, asking for strength through spiritual discipline and guidance to create a closer relationship with God. Rather than giving up something, many take time to give by volunteering more time and resources where there is need.

The most important outcome from your Lenten journey is to spend more time with God and focus on a relationship with Him. Whether the physical touch of ashes to your forehead brings that about or the extra time at worship, through fasting, or in prayer. At the end of your 40 day walk, may it be that you have drawn closer to God and humbly repent of your sin so you can find joy and praise for the risen Lord on Easter morning.

Since Adam, humans' sin and death is real. But when you humble yourself, admitting your weakness, that you have sinned and deserve death, you will find comfort in knowing you have been forgiven and made right to stand before God through mercy and grace causing you to be at peace in this world, confident in the promise God has given to you, of life after death for all who trust in Christ Jesus as their Savior.

With or without ashes, let the physical presence of Jesus renew your spirit and lead you to a closer relationship with God.

Beth St Martin to speak on drug addiction on telling Ryan's Story

Beth Koch St Martin of Milbank, SD will speak at Grace Lutheran at 7:30 pm, Wednesday evening, following Lenten worship on March 29th. Her talk is called Ryan's Story and tells the story of a family dealing with the addiction of a child and the pain and grief of dealing with the loss of a loved one. The goal of Ryan's Story is trying to "erase some of the stigma around drug addiction" and help people understand it can happen to anyone. St Martin tells the story from the non-addict view and then talks about grief, coping with grief, and "what I do to cope with grief" she said. Officer Alexis Buysse from the Watertown Police Department will be on hand to answer questions about what local law enforcement are dealing with.

St Martin was to speak during the Mini-Youth gathering in January, which was cancelled. Several expressed interest in hearing this story about addiction. With the increase in drugs in our community and upcoming events of prom and graduation, we are providing this opportunity to hear this story in hope it may save another family the pain and grieve of losing a child through the heartache of addiction Everyone is welcome.

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday February 9th, 2023 at 6pm with Mark Briley Presiding. Also present was LeRoy Bullis, Rebecca Anderson-Brasel, Sherry Jongeling, Marian Raml, Ted Frost, Gena Urevig, Mark Briley, Kelly Evjen, Ronda Lorenz, Terra Koistinen, Travis Schulz, Lindsey Moeller, Dylan Jordan, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett, and Kat Anderson. Absent were Adam Wientjes, Kayla Mohling, and Steve Schlenner.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Marian Raml and seconded by Rhonda Lorenz. Motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes for the January 12th, 2023 meeting was made by Kelly Evjen and seconded by Ted Frost. Motion carried.

Items:

Financial Report – Kat Anderson reported the total monthly income to the general fund was \$25,661.86, the weekly giving average was \$4,269, and the weekly worship attendance was 58 for the month of January. A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Gena Urevig and seconded by Sherry Jongeling. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report –Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett continues to visit care centers and assisted living homes. There was one baptism in January. Pastor spent time with the preschoolers singing songs with them. She noted that there will be the addition of a Spanish service on Ash Wednesday at 8pm as well as on Easter Sunday. Pastor has been putting together the details for the Jamboree in April and also noted the date of the Got It At Grace Craft/Vendor fair on March 11th.

Old Business:

Ukraine Refuge Sponsorship – Pastor Cheryl reported that the bank account has been set up and the letter of intent is almost ready to send with that information.

140th Celebration (Sept. 16th & 17th 2023) – No new information

Annual Committee Reports and revised descriptions – a new handbook was handed out. If a committee feels that their description is incorrect please notify Pastor Cheryl.

Nominating Committee- Welcome to the new council members.

New Business

- 1. The resignation of Becky Sprouse as Youth and Family director was accepted. Becky will stay on until the position is filled or May 15th, whichever is earlier.
- 2. Personnel Discussion The council shared ideas of items to put in the job description and the possibility of combining 2 part time positions to create a full time position. The Staff Support Committee will be notified of the position and write a new description for it.
- 3. Utilization of Choir Room Discussion on the revamping of the choir room was discussed. The pit should be filled in as it is a safety concern and we can utilize the room for more things. Discussion tabled until next month. No decision was made.
- 4. Committees New Council Tarra chose to be on Youth, Family, & Education, and Fellowship & Outreach. Travis chose to be on Staff Support. Lindsey chose to be on Staff Support, and to fill the open seat on the Foundation. Additional lay members are needed to fill positions and will be sought.
- 5. Red Cross Blood Drive Community Club Marian Raml motioned to keep doing the Blood Drive Community Club where we do the recruiting and in turn receive utility bill credits if we meet our goal. Ted Frost seconded. Motion carried.
- 6. Foundation Grant Requests Sherry Jongeling put one in for the 140th. Council members were reminded that grants are due February 15th.

Committee reports:

Education, Youth, & Family – Becky Sprouse's resignation, addition of Terra Koistinen.

Foundation – Gena Urevig reported that things are going well. Grants will be selected at the March 9th meeting.

Finance & Stewardship – Reported that they are looking into QR codes for contributions during special events.


