Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On the last Sunday of September, we will Celebrate YOU!

Some may think that it is not right to do this, as we have heard "pride come before the fall," and God opposes the proud as written in James 4:6.

But scriptures also tell us to celebrate when we have faithfully offered all to the Lord and dedicated it to the Lord for His glory as Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 10 "³⁰If I partake with thankfulness, why should I be denounced because of that for which I give thanks? ³¹So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God."

When we dedicate our time and our projects to God, recognizing everything has come from him, then we are also to dedicate our celebration to Him, as written about in Nehemiah 12

when the Levites were brought to the wall of Jerusalem to celebrate joyfully with songs of thanksgiving, music, and choirs to sing from the top of the wall.

It is right to celebrate and be filled with joy for what God has blessed us with as Proverbs 15 tells us, "¹³A happy heart makes the face cheerful." It is when we praise ourselves and forget that all things come from God, forgetting to give thanks and praise to Him for His gifts, that we get into trouble.

So on Sunday, September 25th at a 10:30 am worship (that's right – just one service on the 25th) we will offer up our praise and thanks for God's great blessing on our recent project at Grace Lutheran: meeting our goals of \$171,000 for "the "Raise the Roof" funds. We will sing. make music, and hear God's words of celebration and promise.

The day will also be about something more than celebration. It will be about fellowship and the coming together of all those who have provided through their time, talents, and resources to reach this goal.

Now I know there are some like me who in the past did not believe fellowship was important. In fact, I thought it was quite unnecessary. But I have come to understand how being in fellowship with other faith-filled people is extremely important, and even more so in these days as Satan turns people from God to worldly interest.

Fellowship provides a support system of our faith, to keep us focused on God's love and all that He has provided for us as the preacher writes in Hebrews 10: "24 And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, 25 not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

Fellowship heals the heart and puts it at peace with one another as Paul writes to the Ephesians 2: "¹³But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. ¹⁴For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us."

Fellowship is the smile on another's face as you enter the sanctuary for worship, showing, you are welcomed; it is the friendly eyes that see you over a cup of coffee to listen when you have become weary; and it is the comforting hand upon your shoulder in times of suffering that tells you I am so sorry for your struggle or for your loss. It is person to person and face to face with other faithful followers of Jesus, which you cannot get when you do not take time to come together.

First John 1 explains, "We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete. ⁵This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. ⁶If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; ⁷but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin."

You are promised, your joy may be complete, to celebrate the blessings that God has given you when you come together in fellowship, to work together for His glory, and to offer up praise and thanksgiving as written for you in Philippians 4, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things."

So on September 25th, come together for worship and stay for fellowship with potluck. Take time to celebrate YOU in this great accomplishment through a COVID pandemic, lock downs, shutdowns, and the hard work that all of you have done to achieve this blessing given to you by God. Take time to join together in fellowship, to get to know each other more, to offer support through your presences, and be the face of the love of Christ to each other.

For, "moreover, it is God's gift that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in all their toil." (Ecclesiastes 3:13)

God has bestowed this blessing upon you, Grace Lutheran, your cup overflows. Let us praise God together.

Minutes of the Grace Lutheran Council meeting on Thursday, August 11, 2022

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday, August 11, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. with Rick Brownell presiding. Also present was Mark Briley, Paul Henrichs, Kelly Evjen, Sherry Jongeling, Kayla Mohling, Adam Wientjes, LeRoy Bullis, Marian Raml, Steve Schlenner, Rebekah Brasel Anderson and Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett. Absent were Paul Henrichs, Geri Mohor, Ted Frost, Gena Urevig, Rhonda Lorenz, and Cindy Vander Leest.

A motion was made by Kayla Mohling and seconded by Sherry Jongeling to accept Rebekah Brasel Anderson to the council as a replacement for Denise Biller who resigned last month. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Kelly Evjen and seconded by Marian Raml. Motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes for the July 14, 2022 meeting was made by Kelly Evjen and seconded by Marian Raml. Motion carried.

Items:

- **1. Financial Report-** Cindy Vander Leest attached a copy of the financial report. Sherry Jongeling reported the monthly income to the general fund was \$19,606, the weekly average giving was \$3,921 and the weekly worship attendance was 66. A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Mark Briley and seconded by Marian Raml. Motion carried.
- 2. Pastor's Report--- Pastor Cheryl continues to visit and serve communion at our care centers and had 4 funerals. She also attended a Ukranian Refugee Meeting. She also has been meeting with some of the committees to get them going again and has a few more to do. She talked with council about getting people to participate in the Be-A-Friender group, that will call or visit the elders in our church. In August she plans to attend the ordination of Brenda Handel-Johnson in St. Cloud MN. Monthly report was given to all council members with other upcoming events.

Old Business:

- 1. Ukraine Refugee Sponsorship- One meeting was held and more information is needed before committing to a sponsorship. The next comunity meeting is on August 22nd at the Midwest Bible Camp. Pastor encouraged the council members to go.
- **2. Funeral Policy Update-** The policy was reviewed and changing the fees were discussed. It was agreed to go up on fees for non members so we would be comparable to other churches in the area. The fee changes listed were approved. Marian Raml made a motion to approve the new funeral policy with the fee updates and seconded by Kelly Evjen. Motion carried
- 3. 140th Celebration (Sept 16th & 17th 2023) Kayla reported that she has been in contact with Marsha Jelsma about the history. She is also looking into special music. Invitations need to go out soon to previous pastors from Grace.
- 4. Rebekah Brasel Anderson accepted the position on the council to finish out Denise Billers term.
- **5. Appreciation Sunday and potluck-** Sunday, September 25th with one worship service at 10:30 with a potluck to follow. The council will be responsible for helping serve and clean up. We will host this celebration and thank those that helped reach our goal.

New Business:

- 1. Committee Assignments James Gobel has agreed to by on the finances and Stewardship committee and Rebekah Anderson will be on fellowship and outreach.
- **2.** Transfer to Radio & Flower checking acct from Edward Jones Radio Acct. The council discussed the amount to transfer and agreed on \$2000. A motion was made by LeRoy Bullis and seconded by Adam Wientjes. Motion carried
- **3. Annual fundraiser** Pastor Cheryl is working with a member of our church to see about starting an annual fundraising event. The council is in agreement that we need to have an annual fundraiser to help support the church. There will be more on this later as details are worked out. A tentative date is set for August 18th thru 20th, 2023.

Confirmation Students need Mentors

A confirmation mentor plays an important part in the spiritual formation of an adolescent student during their faith formation years. This formal mentor relationship will take place several times a year while the student is enrolled in the 2-year confirmation program at Grace Lutheran Church. These meeting or activities occur in an informal setting but may build a relationship lasting a lifetime.

Along with the parents and pastor, the mentor will form an important connection with the student to encourage and support them in their learning.

Meeting times are flexible, and mentors will decide together what works best for schedules. Mentors are encouraged to meet no less than 4 times a year and not more than once a month. Meetings can include: to go out to eat together, attending a sporting event together, go to the movies together, or just hang out to talk. Whatever the two determine is how time together will be spent to build a relationship.

If you can be a mentor to a student, contact Pastor Cheryl. A meeting for mentors will be scheduled at a later date.

God's Work Our Hands Wednesday September 28th

LCW (Glace Lutheran Church Women) collect materials for kits for World Relief which are put together on God's Work Our Hands day. This year the date has been changed to a Wednesday evening, September 28th beginning at 4 pm. This will provide an opportunity for Confirmation students to help with putting them together.

Materials for School, Baby Care, and Personal Care items can be purchased prior to that date and left in the tubs in the Narthex. Please check the needs as several supplies have already been donated. A monetary donation can be made for GLCW to purchase any items they are short on. All members are asked to assist in combining these kits to send to World Relief.

School kits

FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 ½"; no loose leaf paper; ONE 30 centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other; ONE pencil sharpener

ONE pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well); FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band; FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band; ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons; ONE 2 ½" eraser (NOTE: The book bags have been purchased.)





Baby Care Kits

TWO lightweight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies ®); TWO long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet); TWO receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, between 36" and 52" square; FOUR cloth diapers, flat fold preferred; ONE jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap; TWO pairs of socks; ONE hand towel, dark color recommended; TWO or three bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original

wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars; TWO diaper pins or large safety pins

Personal Care Kits

ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended; TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging*; ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging; ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

On Wednesday, September 28th at 4 pm, members are encouraged to join together in the Fellowship Hall to put the kits together. The process includes working in one of the lines for

either school, baby care, or personal care where all the materials are laid out and each person goes down the line to pick up the items for one kit. The work is not hard and with many people, goes quickly. God's Work will be done through the many volunteer hands of His people.

On October 2nd, these kits will be loaded in trucks that pick up the kits from the many congregations in the area. Your help will be needed on that day as well. Watch more details on the time for loading.

Ukraine Refuge sponsorships meeting

A meeting is scheduled for Sunday, September 18th at 9:30 in the Fellowship Hall on sponsorship of Ukrainian refugees with Lee Gabel to speak and answer question about the program.

This special authorization comes from the federal government as a humanitarian parolee for churches and organization to provided assistance. Primary sponsors are responsibility for the financial load, transportation, clothing, furnishing, and housing through commitment and fundraising.

Help is available to assist the refugee with mainstream benefits: SNAP; TANF; Medicaid; SSI; all coordinated by LSS. Additional assistance is available through the Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) Benefits: Refugee Cash Assistance (RCA); Refugee Medical Assistance (RMA); and Employment Assistance: Refugee Support Services (RSS).

Refugees are not able to work until they have received a social security card and at this time it is taking over a year to obtain those. State Efforts will come through the South Dakota Community Foundation Freedom's Haven Fund. South Dakota has 30,000 open jobs and this work will benefit the SD and Watertown economy from more workers.
