NC3 youth will organize & lead the games, serve the dinner of hotdogs, chips & soda and engage in friendly interaction with the children.

Refugee Projects #5 - Refugee Children's Christmas Toys--Shopping and Delivery

Opportunity for the entire family. Bring children to build bonds with refugees.

Through the refugee Christmas Toys project, NC3ers have for several years shopped for children's Christmas gifts & delivered them in personal visits to refugee families. This project, done in coordination with OASIS International, is currently in transition. If interested in either of the potential opportunities below, please sign up to receive more information as this year's project takes shape.

Service opportunity #1- Shop for toys. You will be provided with the age & gender of the children for whom you shop (one gift per child, usually 4-6 children). The church will reimburse you for the cost. After purchasing, you will wrap & label the toys and deliver them to church. Shopping for gifts does not commit you to deliver gifts. Creative idea: Involve your children or grandchildren in the shopping process to instill their awareness of, and love for, those of other ethnicities suffering hardship.

Service opportunity #2- Deliver the children's Christmas gifts to the homes of refugee families. The delivery visits will be set up ahead of time so the families will be expecting you & excited. Often they invite you in for a visit. Your children or grandchildren are welcome to accompany you and actually help in creating a warm connection with the refugee children & families. Gift deliverers should have prayerful desire to do follow up visits & to pursue ongoing friendship with the family, as opportunity allows.

Our team is made up of two key areas: **Worship Arts** and **Tech**—and we need volunteers in both!

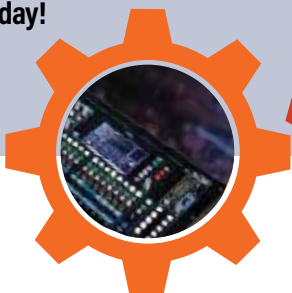

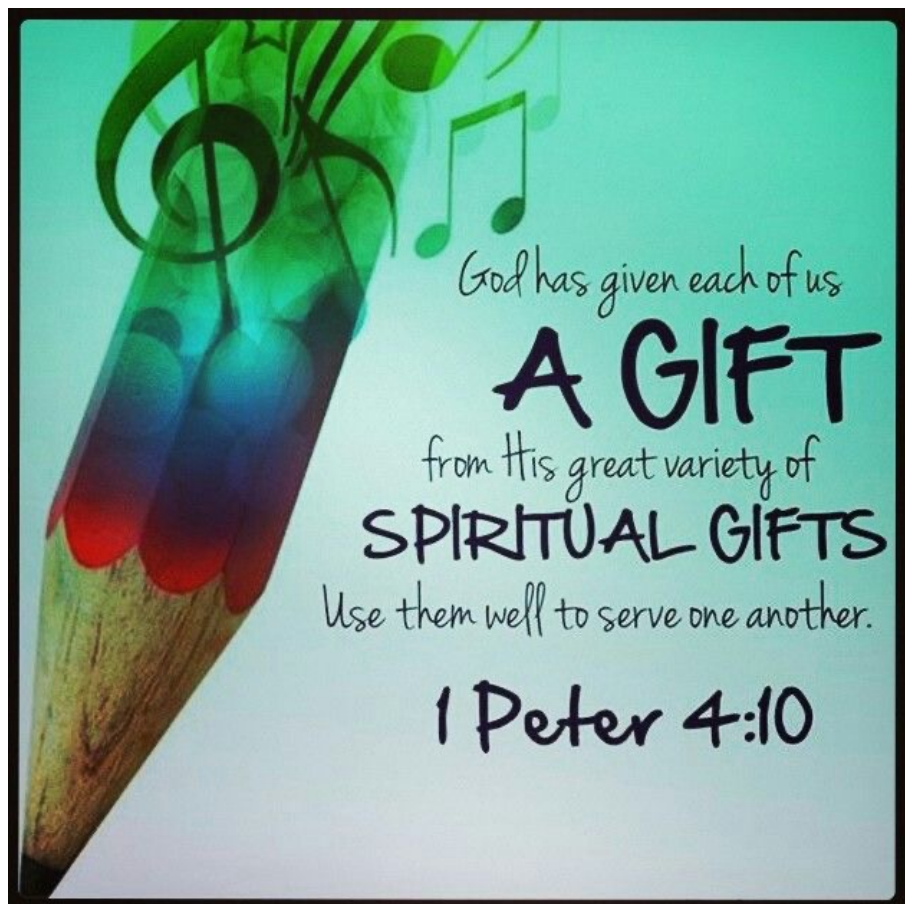
