SERMON SUMMARY

How to Use the Gifts of the Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:4-11)

Summary: Paul instructs the Corinthians to use their spiritual gifts in mutuality and unity, in service to others, and in faithfulness to God and for the sake of his glory.

How Can We Use Our Spiritual Gifts in a Mature Way?

Paul's teaching about how to use the spiritual gifts is basically theological, based on the doctrine of God the Trinity, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit: "There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but the same God works all of them in all men" (1 Cor. 12:4-6).

Different Kinds of Gifts but the Same Spirit – Mutual Respect and Equality

First, Paul teaches the Corinthians that **the Holy Spirit** distributes the different gifts to each of them.

"There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit" (1 Cor. 12:4). We have the tendency to think the gifts of the Spirit, the things of the Spirit, or his works are preserved for a special group of Christians, like pastors or the church leaders. But, as the Spirit dwells in everyone who confesses Christ as the Lord, every one of them is endowed with the gift of the Spirit. "To each" [one] [there is] "the manifestation of the Spirit" (1 Cor. 12:7). Everyone, in whom the Spirit dwells, has the gift of the Spirit. The Spirit dwells within us and empowers us with spiritual gifts.

God created us in different images, characters, and lifestyles. God loves diversity. Every one of us is different. The Holy Spirit gives us different kinds of gifts. God endows us with diverse gifts through the Holy Spirit, so that each one of us may contribute to the edification of the church as the body of Christ.

Furthermore, all our gifts come from the same Spirit. It is the same Spirit who distributes different kinds of gifts to each one of us. The gifts of the Spirit do not produce inequality among us because we have the same Spirit. We have the same status because we have the same Spirit, but different functions according

to the diverse gifts of the Holy Spirit. We must use our gifts with mutual respect, recognizing our uniqueness and differences, and use them for harmony and unity because it is the same Spirit who distributes all these different gifts.

Different Kinds of Service, but the Same Lord – For the Purpose of Serving Others

Second, Paul teaches the Corinthians that the purpose of the Holy Spirit in distributing the gifts to them is to serve others in imitation of **Christ the Lord**. The gifts of the Spirit should be used to serve people, as Christ did: “There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord” (1 Cor. 12:5).

God’s purpose in endowing us with the gifts of the Spirit is to make us use them in service to people. The diakonia of "service" means to serve people, like waiting on a table or as a slave to them. We receive leadership according to our spiritual gifts, and this leadership is given to us to serve people, not to dominate or control them. Our spiritual gifts and our leadership are not indications of our superiority to other people but signs of our servanthood.

What is more, God has given us spiritual gifts so that we may represent Christ our Lord, who came to serve us. According to our spiritual gifts, we receive our leadership to imitate Christ the Lord. We are different in our characters, spiritual gifts, and service but the same in representing the same and one Lord, Christ Jesus (1 Cor. 12:5). We must use them in imitation of Christ Jesus.

Jesus showed an exemplar of the servanthood ministry. The night before the Passover Feast Day, when he was arrested, Jesus washed his disciples’ feet and said to them, “You call me ‘Teacher’ and ‘Lord,’ and rightly so, for that is what I am. Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another’s feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. I tell you the truth, no servant is greater than his master, nor a messenger greater than the one who sent him. Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them” (John 13:13-17). At the time of Jesus, it was the assignment given to slaves to wash other people's feet. By washing his disciples’ feet, Jesus represented the character of his life and ministry. He is the Lord and the Teacher, through whom God’s wisdom and power are revealed. He is the one who existed before the creation of the world and who is the same as God in his power, wisdom, and authority. But he came and served us, and his lordship is manifested through our servanthood.

When we live in servanthood, we will proclaim Christ who lives within us through his Spirit: “But thanks to God, who always leads us in triumphal procession in Christ and through us spreads everywhere the fragrance of the knowledge of him. For we are to God the aroma of Christ among those who are being saved and those who are perishing” (1 Cor. 2:14-15).

Many Kinds of Working, but the Same God – Recognizing God’s Sovereignty and Glory

Third, Paul teaches the Corinthians that it is **God** who works through their service, so they should give glory to God: “There are many kinds of working, but the same God works all of them in all men” (1 Cor. 12:6). We are working to build up the church by using our spiritual gifts or leadership. But it is not we, but God who builds up the church. God works through us, endowing us with spiritual gifts and leadership. We are serving the church by using our spiritual gifts, but it is God who works among us: “What, after all, is Apollos? And what is Paul? Only servants, through whom you came to believe—as the Lord has assigned to each his task. I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow.” (1 Cor. 3:5-7). Therefore, what is required from those who are gifted with the things of the Spirit or leadership is to prove themselves faithful to God, who works through them (1 Cor. 4:2). God is looking for those showing their faithfulness to His grace and work.

In this regard, we are God’s co-workers. God is working through us, and we have the responsibility to manifest God’s work and glory. God makes us the temple of the Holy Spirit through his mercy. We have received the spiritual gifts by his grace: “Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy” (1 Pet. 2:10). Therefore, we are called to give glory to God through our good works, which we have done by using his spiritual gifts (1 Pet. 2:12): “Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God’s grace in its various forms. If anyone speaks, he should do it as one speaking the very words of God. If anyone serves, he should do it with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen” (1 Pet. 4:10-11).

The Diverse Gifts of the Spirit for the Common Good

The manifestation of the Spirit is not the same for everyone. The same Spirit gives different gifts to those in Christ. The same Spirit manifests himself differently according to his gift to each of them. However, the Spirit calls them to work for the common good even though they have different gifts and assignments: “Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good” (1 Cor. 12:7). We must use our gifts to edify the church, not to edify our name and power. Self-satisfaction or self-pride conflicts with the ministry of the Spirit to edify the body of Christ.

The church is the community of the Spirit to manifest and proclaim the image of God, the Trinity. God the Father, God the Son, and God the Spirit are distinctive in their character, being, and work. But they are one and the same God in their power, authority, and ability. This is a mystery. We accept this truth in the light of the Holy Spirit. We are called to testify to God the Trinity through our community, in our speech and action. We are different in our spiritual gifts, work, and leadership. But our differences should not bring us into conflict or jealousy, but into mutual care and love. Our spiritual gifts are to be beneficial to one another and make the church grow so that we may proclaim to the world that we serve one God and one Lord and one Spirit, all of whom are one and the same God. When we humble ourselves, considering others better than us and serving one another, we are manifesting that we dwell together in one and the same God through the same faith in Christ and the presence of the Holy Spirit. We are proclaiming the glory of God to the world.
