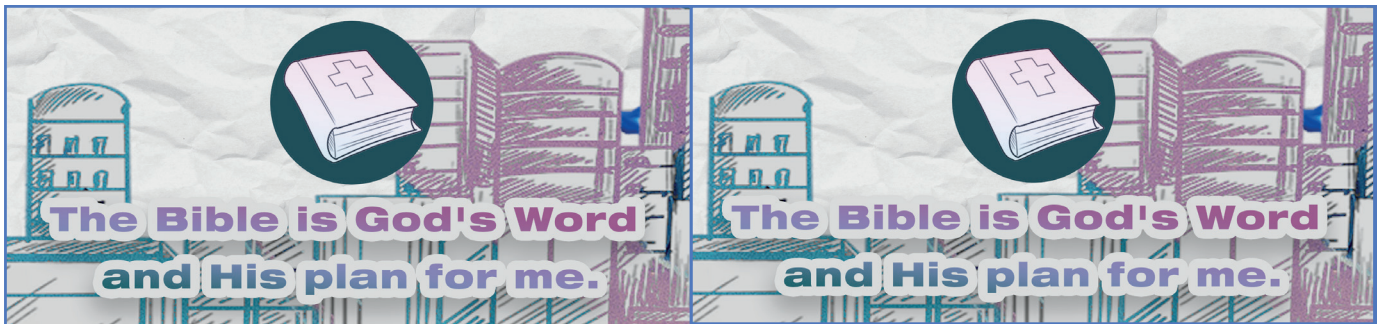


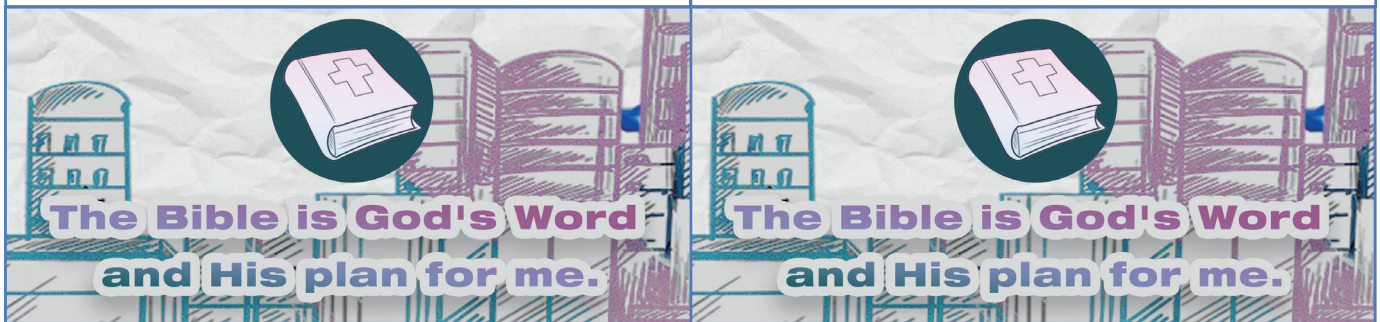

Here are a couple of ways we can know the Bible is true.

1. **Archaeology.** Proof has been dug up! Archaeologists have found the names of King David, Pontius Pilate, and other people carved in ancient stone.
2. **Fulfilled prophecy.** All Bible prophecy about the past has come true—hundreds of them! For example, in Daniel 2, the king's vision predicted future empires of the world including the Romans and Greeks. Only God could have known what the future would hold.

The Bible is a collection of sixty-six books divided into two parts: the Old Testament and the New Testament.

The Old Testament starts with God creating the world and everything in it. The New Testament begins with Jesus' birth. The Bible ends with Revelation, which tells about the future and how God wants us to spend eternity with Him.
