BENEDICTINE SPIRITUALITY

WRITTEN TEXTS AND TRADITION: The Jewish Bible also has internal connections. Jeremiah 52 and 2 Kings 24–25 are almost the same. What does this mean about the literary connection? There are also unique verbal and thematic connections between these books and Deuteronomy. Various theories are offered to explain how this happened. Studying the three together will give a richer insight into the meaning of this revelation.
