HAITI REPRESENTATIVE AT SAINT ANDREW'S: West Tennessee Haiti Partnership, a diocesan ministry that supports St. Vincent's Center for Handicapped Children in Port-au-Prince, will host trauma surgeon Dr. Pierre-Marie Woolley at events in West Tennessee in April. Dr. Woolley is a trauma and orthopedic surgeon who serves in the only fully functioning hospital in the Haitian capital. He was Medical Director of St. Vincent's for years and is a long-standing member of the Board of Directors. He has helped countless children with disabilities and deformities, offering skilled and compassionate care even amid periods of social instability, mass-casualty events, and ongoing humanitarian crisis. On **Apr 12** at 11:30 AM after our 10:30 service, we'll have an informal lunch and discussion with Dr. Woolley in the parish hall. Everyone is welcome, but please sign up so we have enough food.
