3. Have you ever felt compelled to take matters into your own hands because you got tired of waiting? What happened?
4. What's something you've done that you were way too proud of for way too long?
5. When something goes wrong, how easy is it for you to own it fully – and what makes that hard?
6. Have you ever been so sure you were right about something that you didn't even bother to ask anyone else – and then turned out to be completely wrong?
7. What's the difference between being confident and being proud?
8. What's something you built, planned, or organized that you maybe took just a little too much personal ownership over?
9. Saul wanted the honor of the people even after admitting he sinned. Why do you think we care so much about how we look to others even when we know we're wrong?
10. Have you ever given someone else advice about pride or humility and then immediately caught yourself doing the exact thing you warned them about?
