The challenge before us is clear: we must intentionally seek God, remember His character through His Word, and resist the cultural drift toward lawlessness and self-worship. When suffering comes—and it will—we have a choice to either rail against God like Job initially did, or to humble ourselves and ask if He's trying to get our attention. The encouragement is that God woos us even in our distress, calling us back to Himself with patient love.
