5-Day Devotional: The Creator Speaks

Day 1: The Creator Who Holds All Things Together

Reading: Colossians 1:15-20

Devotional: Jesus is not just our Savior—He is the Creator who spoke everything into existence. Before He died for you, He made you. Every atom in your body holds together because of Him. This changes everything about how we approach Him. We often want Jesus to serve our purposes, asking Him to bless our plans. But the Creator deserves supremacy in everything. Today, pause and consider: the same hands that formed galaxies and measured the earth's dimensions were pierced for you. When life feels chaotic, remember that the One who holds the universe together can certainly hold your life together. Let this truth move you from demanding answers to offering worship.

Day 2: Speaking to God from the Storm

Reading: Job 38:1-18

Devotional: God spoke to Job out of the storm—both the storm in nature and the storm in Job's life. Where is your storm today? Financial pressure? Relational conflict? Physical pain? God has not abandoned you in the chaos. In fact, He often speaks most clearly when everything else is stripped away. Job wanted his day in court with God, and he got it—but not in the way he expected. God didn't answer Job's "why" questions. Instead, He revealed His character as Creator. Sometimes we don't need explanations; we need perspective. We need to remember who God is. In your storm today, stop demanding answers and start listening for His voice.

Day 3: Humility Before the Almighty

Reading: Job 38:31-41

Devotional: God's questions to Job were not meant to humiliate but to humble. "Where were you when I laid the earth's foundation?" God asks. The answer is obvious: we weren't there. We know so little, yet we speak as if we understand everything. In our information age, we can search anything on our phones and feel knowledgeable. But true wisdom begins with recognizing how little we actually know. God controls the constellations, commands the dawn, provides for the ravens—details we completely overlook. Today, practice holy humility. Acknowledge that God's ways are beyond your understanding. This isn't defeat; it's the beginning of true faith. When you humble yourself, God promises to lift you up.

#### Day 4: The Fear of the Lord

Reading: Psalm 19:1-14

Devotional: The heavens declare God's glory. The stars speak without words, yet their message reaches everywhere. When was the last time you stopped to truly see creation and let it speak to you? The fear of the Lord isn't terror—it's awe that leads to reverence. It's standing under a starlit sky and feeling both infinitely small and incredibly loved. It's recognizing that the God who names each star also knows your name. This fear keeps us from taking God for granted. It prevents us from treating Him like a cosmic vending machine. Today, step outside and look up. Let creation remind you that you serve a God who is both infinitely powerful and intimately personal.

#### Day 5: Continuing in Faith

Reading: Colossians 1:21-23; Hebrews 11:1-6

Devotional: We are reconciled to God through Christ's death—presented holy, without blemish, free from accusation—if we continue in our faith. This isn't about earning salvation; it's about not abandoning it. Faith isn't a one-time decision but a daily journey of trust. Like Job, we'll face storms that test whether we truly believe God is good. The question isn't whether you started well, but whether you're continuing. Are you still seeking Him? Still talking to Him? Still believing He holds all things together? Without faith, it's

impossible to please God. Today, ask yourself: am I continuing, or have I parked? God wants you growing, not just existing. Continue in faith, established and firm, not moved from the hope of the gospel.
