

2026-03-18 Discussion Questions

How does understanding Jesus as the creator of all things, as described in Colossians 1, change the way you approach prayer and your relationship with Him?

The pastor suggests that we may have stopped hearing God's voice because we are too preoccupied with modern distractions. What practices could help us become still enough to hear from God as people in biblical times did?

Job wanted his day in court with God, but when God finally spoke, He asked Job questions instead of answering his complaints. What does this teach us about approaching God with our grievances?

God speaks to Job out of the storm, whether literal or metaphorical. How can we train ourselves to recognize God's voice in the midst of our personal storms rather than being consumed by them?

The sermon emphasizes that Jesus holds all things together, even atoms. How does this truth about God's sustaining power affect the way you handle anxiety about things falling apart in your life?

When God asks Job if he has comprehended the vast expanses of the earth or seen the gates of death, He is highlighting Job's limited understanding. In what areas of your life are you acting as though you know better than God?

The pastor mentions that we want Jesus to be our servant rather than recognizing Him as Lord and Creator. What would it look like in practical terms to shift from asking Jesus to bless our plans to seeking His purpose first?

Colossians 1:23 says we will be presented holy and blameless if we continue in our faith. What does continuing in faith look like when facing prolonged suffering or unanswered questions like Job experienced?

God describes how He provides for the ravens and waters the desert where no one lives. How does this demonstration of God's care for all creation challenge or comfort you regarding His care for your specific needs?

The sermon compares believers to stars placed in constellations, each with a unique position and purpose in the body of Christ. How might recognizing your specific placement in God's design change the way you view your role in the church community?
