

2026-03-25 Discussion Questions

The pastor describes how God is personally involved in every detail of creation, from mountain goats giving birth to eagles building nests. How does understanding God's intimate involvement in nature change the way you view His involvement in your personal life?

Job's friends tried to defend God but spoke without true knowledge of Him. In what ways might we do the same today when trying to explain God to others or defend His actions?

The sermon suggests that God sometimes breaks our legs like a shepherd does with a wandering sheep so we learn His voice while being carried. What hardships in your life might God have used to draw you closer to Him?

The pastor challenges the idea that we take God's love for granted while forgetting His judgment. How can we hold both God's deep love and His righteous judgment in proper balance?

According to the message, we were created for more than just avoiding hell or living comfortably. What do you think God specifically created you to do that you might be settling for less than?

The sermon mentions that if all our sins were exposed on judgment day, it would eliminate pride and help us serve one another better. How would knowing everyone's deepest struggles change the way we relate to each other in the church?

God asks Job questions about creation not to humiliate him but to show how little Job truly knows. What assumptions about God have you made that might be based more on what you want Him to be like than who He actually is?

The pastor says we are poorly equipped to suffer because we expect everything to go well as Christians. How can we better prepare ourselves and others for the suffering Jesus promised would come?

Romans 2 describes persistence in doing good as seeking glory, honor, and immortality. What is the difference between persistence motivated by relationship with God versus persistence motivated by trying to earn salvation?

The message emphasizes wearing the cross not as jewelry but as an opportunity to share the bloody reality of what Christ did. When was the last time you had an opportunity to explain the true meaning of the cross to someone, and how did you respond?
