What would we say about God if given the chance to speak for an hour? This challenging question sits at the heart of our exploration of Job chapters 34-36, where Elihu continues his lengthy discourse to Job and his friends. The sermon challenges us to examine whether we could articulate what we truly believe about God and back it up with Scripture, or if we'd simply resort to empty platitudes like 'I'm so sorry' without offering genuine spiritual substance. We're confronted with the sobering truth that our words reveal what's truly in our hearts - Jesus taught that out of the overflow of the heart, the mouth speaks. If resentment fills our hearts, resentment will spill from our lips. If love and knowledge of God dwell within us, that too will be evident. The message calls us to become true stewards of God's Word, not just hearers but doers who can minister to others in their suffering with biblical truth rather than philosophical speculation. We're reminded that God doesn't change based on our righteousness or sin - He remains sovereign and complete. Yet remarkably, He invites us into relationship and transformation. The challenge is clear: are we building a foundation of biblical knowledge that enables us to speak truth in love, or are we content with surface-level faith that crumbles when tested?
