

The sermon emphasizes that Jesus is coming soon with rewards for those who serve Him. How does understanding that God watches and rewards our faithful service change your motivation for serving others?

Revelation 22:11 says to let those doing wrong continue in wrong and those doing right continue in right. What do you think Jesus means by this, and how does it challenge our understanding of authentic faith versus pretense?

The pastor shares a personal struggle with giving twenty dollars to a homeless man. When has God convicted you to give beyond your comfort zone, and what did that experience teach you about obedience?

God brought Israel out of slavery and called them to be a holy nation, just as Christ freed us from slavery to sin. In what areas of your life are you still living like a slave rather than embracing the freedom Christ offers?

The Ten Commandments are described as God's keys of insight rather than burdensome rules. How does viewing God's commands as loving guidance rather than restrictions change your relationship with Him?

The sermon mentions that our culture has moved away from honoring the Sabbath and God's standards. What practical steps can you take to set apart time for God in a culture that demands constant productivity?

The pastor states that holiness means separation, stepping away from our natural character into God's character. What specific area of your life is God calling you to separate from the world and live differently?

God promises to bless those who wash their robes and have the right to the tree of life. What does it mean to continually wash your robes in Christ, and how do you maintain spiritual cleanliness?

The Israelites quickly promised to do everything God said, yet soon failed. Why do we struggle to maintain our spiritual commitments, and what can help us move from good intentions to faithful action?

The sermon emphasizes that when we do something we cannot do without God, we discover how close He really is. What is God calling you to attempt that requires complete dependence on Him rather than your own abilities?
