What role does personal repentance play in our ongoing relationship with Christ, even after we have initially received salvation?

How might our comfort and material abundance be obscuring our ability to hear God's voice and live righteously?

In what ways can we ensure we are not just justifying our own sins while judging others for theirs?

How does understanding that God's kindness is meant to lead us to repentance change the way we view both blessings and discipline in our lives?
