Why do you think so many Christians struggle to engage in worship or community, and how does pride play a role in that hesitation?

How can gratitude serve as a weapon against the constant cultural message of wanting more and comparing ourselves to others?

What specific lies about yourself or God have you believed that need to be replaced with scriptural truth?

How would your spiritual life change if you truly believed there is no condemnation for those in Christ Jesus, as Romans 8:1 states?
