

## 2026-05-24 Discussion Questions

The sermon emphasizes the difference between accepting Jesus as Savior versus accepting Him as both Lord and Savior. What practical changes would occur in your daily life if you fully surrendered to Christ as Lord?

David asked God to both lead and guide him in Psalm 31. How do you distinguish between God's leading (the vision and destination) and His guiding (the how and where) in your own spiritual journey?

The speaker confessed to living on the surface level of faith, knowing the right words but not walking in obedience. What areas of your life reveal a gap between what you profess and how you actually live?

Jesus commanded us to love one another as He loved us, which includes calling out sin with truth and grace. How can we balance genuine love with the courage to speak truth into someone's life without being judgmental?

The parable of the wedding banquet shows people rejecting God's invitation for various reasons. What modern distractions or priorities most commonly cause believers to decline God's call in their lives?

The sermon challenges the idea that we can manufacture our own fruits through behavior modification and self-help. Why do you think Christians are tempted to rely on self-improvement rather than Spirit-led transformation?

When Jesus asked Peter, Who do you say that I am, He emphasized that true revelation comes from the Father, not from flesh and blood. How do you differentiate between spiritual revelation and human understanding in your own faith?

The speaker mentioned being afraid to pray with a struggling waitress because he didn't want to seem radical. What fears or social pressures prevent you from stepping out in faith when prompted by the Holy Spirit?

Jesus said that whoever loses their life for His sake will find it. What does it practically mean to lose your life for Christ in today's culture, and what would you need to surrender?

The sermon emphasized that heaven is filled with bad people made righteous by Christ's blood. How does understanding this truth about grace change the way you view yourself and others in the church?
