How does the concept of God as 'Father' shape your understanding of His expectations for your life, and how does this differ from viewing Him solely as judge or king?

In what ways have you experienced resistance or ridicule when living out your faith authentically, and how did you respond in those moments?

Amos was called out of his ordinary life as a shepherd to prophesy. What might God be calling you out of in order to serve Him more fully?

The Israelites became consumed with doing church their own way rather than God's way. How can we discern whether our worship and service are truly honoring to God or merely comfortable to us?

Why do you think people often react defensively or with hostility when confronted with biblical truth, even within the church community?

The sermon mentions that God allows us to fail in our own efforts at righteousness so we'll partner with Him. How have your personal failures drawn you closer to dependence on God?

How does the warning about cheating the poor and vulnerable in Amos relate to our responsibility as Christians in contemporary society and politics?

What does it mean practically to be 'faithful to the end' in a culture that increasingly rejects Christian values and biblical truth?

The priest Amaziah told Amos to go back where he came from and stop prophesying. When has comfort or social acceptance tempted you to silence your witness for Christ?

Jesus warned about wars, rumors of wars, and the end times but told His followers not to be alarmed. How can we maintain both spiritual alertness and peace in uncertain times?
