How does the imagery of light versus darkness in Revelation 12 challenge you to examine where you might be dwelling in spiritual darkness rather than reflecting God's light?

In what ways have you experienced the tug of war between your flesh and God's will, and how have you responded when faced with that conflict?

The sermon mentions that grace is not a license to sin but rather should lead to transformation. How do you balance receiving God's grace while also taking responsibility for your spiritual growth?

When you face difficulties or hardships, do you tend to question God's plan or trust that He can write you through it? What would it look like to shift your perspective?

The passage from 2 Chronicles 15 states that the Lord is with you when you are with Him. How does this conditional relationship challenge modern ideas about God's unconditional presence?

How might your witness to non-believers be affected if you truly lived as though you valued Christ's sacrifice more than your own comfort or preferences?

The sermon describes Satan as the accuser of the brethren who leads the world astray. Where do you see evidence of accusation and division in your own life or community, and how can you resist it?

What would change in your daily life if you genuinely believed that holiness and godly living matter deeply to God because of the price Jesus paid for your salvation?

The message emphasizes seeking God consistently rather than only in times of trouble. How can you cultivate a practice of seeking God during seasons of blessing and peace?

How does understanding the body of Christ as a team pulling together in spiritual tug of war change the way you view your need for other believers in your life?
