Using the analogy of a deck of cards, we're confronted with how we approach God's Word: some keep their Bibles pristine and unopened, others cling only to children's stories, and many hold onto a single favorite verse while ignoring the rest. But Jesus calls us to something far deeper—to engage with the whole will of God. Throughout Luke's Gospel, we encounter a consistent pattern: Jesus doesn't just invite belief, He demands complete surrender. When Peter experienced the miraculous catch of fish, he fell to his knees recognizing his unworthiness, yet Jesus said 'follow me'—and Peter left everything. When Levi heard that same call, he abandoned his tax collector's booth immediately. This isn't about earning salvation through works, but about understanding that genuine faith transforms how we live. The passages reveal uncomfortable truths: we're called to love our enemies, give without expecting return, and recognize that blessing often comes through hardship rather than prosperity. Jesus warns that anyone who puts their hand to the plow and looks back isn't fit for the kingdom. The question confronting us is whether we're truly following Christ or merely holding onto a decision we made years ago while living independently ever since. True discipleship means daily taking up our cross, reading Scripture not just to know it but to be changed by it, and praying 'not my will but Yours be done' even when it costs us everything.
