What does it look like to live with a heart fully surrendered to God? This message takes us deep into the life of Jehoshaphat, a king who was far from perfect yet made a profound difference because his heart was genuinely oriented toward God. Drawing from 2 Chronicles 18 and 19, we walk through a dramatic battlefield scene where Jehoshaphat finds himself surrounded by enemy chariots, mistaken for the very king his enemies most wanted to destroy. In that moment of crisis, he cried out, and God moved. That single detail carries enormous weight for us today. We are reminded that fear is not the enemy of faith, but rather the invitation to exercise it. The question is not whether fear will show up in our lives, but what we do in the moment it arrives. Do we spiral into worst-case thinking, or do we cry out to the One who is already aware of every detail? The message challenges us to close the gap between the moment fear strikes and the moment we turn to God, and to trust that He is not only capable of intervening but actively watching for hearts that are committed to Him.
